Extract of a Letter from Lieutenant Henry Kent, commanding the Dover Armed Transport, to the Commissioners for the Transport Service, dated at Spithead, March 27, 1797.

AGreeable to Orders I received from Sir John Jervis, I sailed with the Ship under my Command from Lisbon on the 9th Instant, with a fresh Breeze from the Northward. On Sunday the 12th at Noon I discovered a Brig, bearing N. N. W. I instantly crowded all the Sail I could carry, and having the Advantage of squally Weather, I gained on her fast. At Midnight I got within Reach, and

after firing a few Shot at her, she hove to. I immediately boarded her, took Possession, and put Mr. Isaac Jarman, Master of the Dover, into her as Prize Master. She proves to be His Catholic Majesty's Brig the Magallanes, commanded by Don Jacinto de Vargas Machuea, a very fine Copper bottomed Vessel, pierced for Eighteen Guns, (had only Four mounted) and navigated by Thirty-six Men, sails remarkably fast, and is well fitted for her Voyage.

THIS Day his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant went in State to the House of Peers, and being seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Mr. Bryan Connor, Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from his Excellency to the House of Commons, signifying his Pleasure that they should immediately attend his Excellency in the House of Peers. An Act for granting for One Year the several Duties therein mentioned in Lieu of all other Duties payable upon the Articles therein specified during the said Term, and for regulating the Trade between this Kingdom and His Majesty's Colonies; and for other Purposes therein mentioned.

An Act for granting to His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors, several Duties therein mentioned, to be levied by the Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties.

An Act for granting to His Majesty for One Year, the Duties therein mentioned on Fire-Hearth, in Lieu of all Duties payable on the same during the said Term.

An Act for granting to His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors, certain Duties and Rates upon the Portage and Conveyance of all Letters and Packets within this Kingdom.

An Act for regulating the Payment of Bounties on the Exportation of certain Manufactures of this Kingdom.

An Act for the Reduction of Drawbacks and Bounties now allowed on the Exportation of Sugar.

An Act for punishing Mutiny and Desertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters within this Kingdom.

An Act to enable certain Inhabitants of the County of Armagh, who have been injured in their Persons or Properties, to recover Compensation for such Injuries by Presentment, notwithstanding the Time by Law prescribed for applying for such Presentments be lapsed.
