S I R, **D**E pleafed to inform their Lordfhips, that I have received a Letter from Captain Lloyd, of His Majefty's Sloop Racoon, acquainting me, that at. One, A. M. on the 20th Inflant, Fairlight bearing N. N. E. Diffance about Five or Six Leagues, he gave Chace to a Cutter, and at Three came up with and captured Les Amis French Privateer, mounting 'Two Carriage Guns, [Four-Pounders, Six Swivels, and manned with Thirty-one Men, which left Boulogne the preceding Evening at Seven, and had only captured one Veffel, which he had the good Fortune to retake, the Good Intent, James Marthall, Mafter, in Ballaft, bound and belonging to Sunderland.

Herewith Enclose you a Letter which I have this Moment received from Captain Digby, of His Majefty's Ship the Aurora.

### His Majesty's Ship Aurora, at Sea, March 29, 1797.

SIR,

I Have to inform you, that the French Privateer Neptune was, on the 27th Inflant, captured by the Aurora after a Chace of Eight Hours, Thirtyeight: Leagues to the Westward of Cape Finisterre. She had been out Thirty-four Days from Nantes, and had taken the Vessels named in the Margin \*,

is pierced for Sixteen Gam, Six of which were thrown overboard during the Chace, and had-on. Board Ninety Men when the left Nantes.

I Enclose, for the Information of the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, a Letter from Captain Bligh, of His Majetly's Sloop the King's Fisher, relating the Particulars of his capturing Le General, French Privateer, after a fhort Refiftance.

## King's Fisher, Tagus, March 30, 1797.

SIR,

I Beg Leave to acquaint you, that Yefterday Morning, Oporto bearing E. N. E. diftant Sixteen Leagues. we difcovered a Brig to the Weftward, ftanding towards us. At Nine A M. we perceived fhe had tacked, on which I made Sail in Chace, and at a Quarter before Four P. M. came up with her; when, after exchanging Two or Three Broadfides. fhe ftruck, and proved to be Le General, Privateer, of Bourdeaux, pierced for 18 Guns, but mounting 14, Four and Three Pounders, and manned with 104 Men, One of whom was killed, and Three wounded. We had not a Man hurt. She had been out Fifteen Days, and had taken an Englifh Brig, from Faro, bound to Falmouth.

Le General is exceedingly well equipped, and is faid to be a faft failing Vettel, but had loft her Fore Top-Gallant Maft and Bowfprit in the late Gales, and was fteering for Vigo to repair her Damages.

Extract of a Letter from the Hon. William Waldegrave, Vice-Admiral of the Blue, to Mr. Nepean, dated on Board His Majesty's Ship Flora, at Spithead, the 24th of April, 1797.

I BEG that you will pleafe to inform the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty that I failed from Lifbon, with my Flag on Board His Majefty's Ship Flora, Captain Middleton Commander, on the 3d of this Month, and arrived this Day at Spithead, in Company with the Pearl Frigate.

On the 12th Inftant I fell in with the above Frigate, Lat. 43 deg. 48 min. North; Long. 13 deg. 11 min. Weft, fhe being then in Chace of a French Privateer; we inftantly joined in the Chace, which compelled the Enemy to haul her Wind, notwithftanding which, it was not until the 13th, at Three Quarters paft Eleven P. M. that we found ourfelves close
