Commissioners for the Execution of the Office of Lord High Admiral of *England*.

Dublin, April 9. This morning the Lord Lieutenant signed a Warrant for the Pardon of *Lawry*, a *Scottish* man, Minister in the County of *Fermanagh* and his five Servants, for killing five notorious Tories in that Countrey, wounding two others to death, as is believed, and taking the eighth. The Parson killed three of them with his own hand; and while another of the Tories was going to draw the Trigger of his Gun to shoot him, his Hand was cut off by one of the Parsons Servants.

Dublin, April 16. It appearing by the Examination of *John Totty* one of the Officers at *Mace* in this City, taken upon Oath, that going in pursuance of an Order of the Council Board, with the Magistrates and other Officers to a Mass-House, on the *Merchants Key*, (where they found a Priest, and many People assembled together) to require them to forbear their Meetings; and the said *Totty* taking the Priest by the Shoulder, and pulling him away, the said Priest cried out, *That he would be revenged for it*: And that the same night, between 9 and 10, the said *Totty* was met with near the *Tholsell*, by four or five persons, unknown to him who did very much abuse him, knockt him down, stampt upon him, and wounded him with a Sword. The Lord Lieutenant and Council have published a Proclamation for the searching for, and apprehending the said Persons, promising a Reward of 20 *l.* to any person that shall discover any of the said Offenders, so that they be taken and brought to Justice; and if any of the Offenders shall discover the rest, he sha^l have the same Reward, and his Pardon.

Bridlington, April 17. Yesterday past by this place to the Southwards 100 Sail of laden Colliers. There are now at Anchor in this Bay 15 Sail of light Vessels, the Wind being at N.

Plymouth, April 18. Yesterday arrived here the *John and Sarah*, Captain *Exton* Commander, who came from the *Canaries* in company of about 60 Sail of Merchantmen, under the Convoy of the *Greenwich*, the *Dartmouth*, and another of His Majesties Frigats, from whom this Vessel separated in a storm, about 100 Leagues to the Westward.

Lyme, April 21. Yesterday a small Vessel called the *William and Sarah*, bound for *Holland* from *Morlaix*, put in here, to avoid two *Turks* Men of War, as he very much suspects them to be, because he saw them chase a small Vessel, who likewise escaped them. It is reported that some of these Pyrats have been as high as the *Ile of Wight*, and that *Sir Robert Robinson* met with five of them, whom he chased into *Brest*.
