The Lord Chamberlain, Vice Chamberlain, with a Herald, and Drums and Trumpets, returned to attend the Bride ; the Senior Herald remaining in the Chapel to conduct the several Persons to their respective Places.

Upon entering the Chapel, the several Persons in the Procession were conducted to the Places appointed for them; Their Majesties to Their Chairs of State, and the rest of the Royal Family to the Seats prepared for them on the Haut-Pas.

At the Conclusion of the Marriage Service, Their Majesties retired to their Chairs of State under the Canopy, where they remained while the Anthem was performing. The Procession afterwards returned in the following Order :

The Procession, at the Return, filed off in the Privy Chamber. Their Majesties, the Bride and Bridegroom, with the rest of the Royal Family, and the Great Officers, proceeded into the Levee Chamber, where the Registry of the Marriage was attested with the usual Formalities : After which the Procession was resumed, and continued into the Lesser Drawing-Room ; and their Majesties, with the rest of the Royal Family, passed into the Great Council Chamber, where the Great Officers, Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction, paid their Compliments on the Occasion ; which were also received by the Bride and Bridegroom in Her Majesty's Apartments.

Copy of a Letter from Admiral Sir John Jervis, K. B. Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels employed on the Coast of Portugal, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated Ville de Paris, off Cadiz, April 29, 1797.

S I R,

I Inclose, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, Captain Martin's Report of the Chace and Capture of Two Spanish Frigates, which, for the Skillfulness shewn in rounding a dangerous Ledge of Rocks, called the Laja de Cape Rocha, a little to the Northward of Conil, and the Decision in making the Attack after the Frigates were anchored, displayed one of the most notable Actions that ever came under my Observation.

S I R,

I BEG Leave to acquaint you, that on the Morning of the 26th, at Six A. M. I gave Chace, in His Majesty's Ship under my Command, to Two Ships in the S. E. in Company with the Emerald, and that at Half past Two P. M. we attacked them in Conil Bay, near Trafalgar, where they had anchored; that at Four they struck to His Majesty's Ships, and proved to be the Spanish Frigates Elona and Ninfa, mounting 36 Guns and 320 Men each, from the Havanna, bound to Cadiz. The former cut her Cable after she had struck, and ran on Shore; and notwithstanding we got her off, from the Damage she received, we were not able to keep her afloat. Part of the Crews left the Ships, and got on Shore.

From every Account I have been able to collect, the Two Frigates had 18 Men killed and 30 wounded. The Irresistible had One Man killed and One wounded.

ON the 16th Instant, Cape Finisterre bearing S. S. W. Eighteen Leagues, His Majesty's Ship under my Command, after a Chace of Six Hours, captured L'Enfant de la Patrie French Privateer, belonging to Bourdeaux, of Sixteen Guns and 130 Men, Eight Days out of Port, and had not taken any Thing: Her Captain, who I understand from the Prisoners, was in Liquor, fired his Guns and Musquetry, and run on Board the Boston; by which Raskness Five of his Men were killed, himself drowned, and Ten Men wounded.

Extract of a Letter from Rear-Admiral Sir John Orde, Bart. Commanding Officer of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels at Plymouth, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated the 17th of May, 1797.

I Have much Satisfaction in transmitting, for their Lordships Information, a Letter received from Lieutenant Dent, Commander of the Spider Schooner, of Sixteen Guns and Fifty Men, giving me an Account of his having captured and brought into this Port the Flibustier French Privateer, of Fourteen Guns and Seventy Men.

I Have the Honor to inform you, that on the 16th Instant, being then Six Leagues to the Southward of the Lizard, in His Majesty's Schooner under my Command, I gave chase to a Brig, which I soon perceived to be an Enemy; when, after receiving the Fire of her Stern Chaces, and a smart Run for Three Hours, I had the Pleasure of capturing her close under the Lizard. She proves to be the Flibustier Privateer, of Fourteen Guns, (Four of which were thrown overboard in the Chace) and Seventy Men, commanded by M. Henry Capel, Eleven Days from St. Maloes, and had not made any Capture. I have the Honor to be, &c. &c. &c.

Extract of a Letter from Captain Charles White, of His Majesty's Ship Vesta, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated Vesta, in the Humber, May 16, 1797.

I Have the Honor to request you will acquaint the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty of my Return this Day to the Humber, from Ellsneur, having brought in with me the Ja-

louse National Corvette, commanded by C. Plucket, which I captured at Five A. M. on the 13th Instant, after a Chace of Nine Hours, and running about Eighty-four Hours; she fired her Stern Chaces at me (Two long French Twelves) for an Hour and a Half, before I was able to put along-side of her; but having had the good Fortune to shoot away her Fore-Yard, and greatly injure her Main-Mast, she found herself under the Necessity of striking, after about Three Broadfides. I am happy to add that we have not a Man hurt, though we have suffered considerable Damage in our Yards, Sails and Rigging, which their Lordships will see by the inclosed Statement of our Defects.

She is pierced for Twenty Guns, and had at the Time of Action Sixteen mounted, namely, Twelve very long French Twelve-Pounders, and Four Sixes, with One Hundred and Fifty-three Men, Two of whom were killed, and Five wounded; she also shifted her Guns over to the vacant Ports.

I BEG to inform you, that this Day, in Company with His Majesty's Ships Phœbe, Cleopatra, Childers Brig, and Duke of York Lugger, I captured, and dispatched to England, the French Ship La Nouvelle Eugenie, a razée Privateer, of Sixteen Guns, and One Hundred and Twenty Men, Four Days out of Nantes, on a Cruizé of Thirty Days: I am happy to inform you she has made no Prizes.

On Wednesday the 12th His Imperial Majesty removed to Kremlin, preparatory to his Coronation, which took Place, with an extraordinary Degree of Splendor, on Sunday last, the 16th Instant.

On Tuesday following the Foreign Ministers had the Honour of being admitted to a public Audience of His Imperial Majesty, for the Purpose of congratulating His Imperial Majesty, in the Name of their Sovereigns; and Yesterday a Ball was given at Court, at which the Foreign Ministers were present.

Whitehall, May 10, 1797.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that on the Evening of Sunday last, the 7th Instant, between the Hours of Eight and Nine o'Clock, as Sydey Fryer, of Holborn, Esq; and a young Lady his Cousin, were passing through the Fields leading from White Conduit Horse to Islington, they discovered Three Men in the Act of Robbing a Woman; that upon approaching near them one of the Party advanced to the said Sydey Fryer, Esq; and inhumanly murdered him, by shooting him through the Head with a Pistol; and that after rifling his Pocket of his Money, a Gold Hunting Watch with Steel Chain and Two Gold Seals, and robbing the young Lady who had accompanied him, they made their Escape.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the atrocious Murder above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to either of the Persons concerned in the said Murder (except the Person who actually perpetrated the same) who shall discover his Accomplices therein.

After which the List will be recalled the First and Third Wednesdays in every Month, that all Persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable to them; and not only bring with them the Affidavit required, touching their not having enjoyed the Benefit of any Public Employment, either at Sea or on Shore during the Time they are to be paid their Half-Pay, but also to produce Certificates that they have subscribed to the Test, and taken the Oaths of Allegiance required by Act of Parliament to His present Majesty: And in case any of the said Officers should not be able to attend themselves, but employ Attornies for that Purpose, that the said Attornies do produce the like Certificates and Affidavits from the Persons they are employed by.

Where Officers are Abroad on Leave, their Agents are to produce attested Copies of such Leave, before the Half-Pay can be paid.

And as by an Act of Parliament passed in the Thirty-fifth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for establishing a more easy and expeditious Method for the Payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy," it is enacted by the 20th Clause of the said Act, "That if any Commissioned or War-
