THIS Day the Solemnity of the Marriage of His Serene Highness Frederick William, Hereditary Prince of Wirtemberg-Stuttgart, with Charlotta-Augusta-Matilda, Princess Royal of Great Britain, Lady of the Imperial Order of Russia of St. Catherine, and eldest Daughter of King George III. was performed in the Chapel Royal by the Archbishop of Canterbury. The Processions to and from the Chapel were in the following Order :

The Procession of the BRIDEGROOM.

Drums and Trumpets.

Kettle Drums.

Serjeant Trumpeter.

Master of the Ceremonies, with One of the Chief Officers of the Bridegroom.

The Bridegroom's Gentleman of Honor, between Two Senior Heralds.

His Majesty's Vice Chamberlain.

His Majesty's Lord Chamberlain.

The BRIDEGROOM,

supported by Two married Dukes, viz.

Duke of Leeds.

Duke of Beaufort.

Officers of the Bridegroom.

On entering the Chapel, His Serene Highness was conducted to the Seat prepared for him near Her Majesty's Chair of State, on the Right Side of the Haut-Pas, leading to the Altar; and the Baron de Rieger, Minister from the Duke of Wirtemberg, (who followed the Bridegroom in the Procession) to a Seat in an Angle of the Haut-Pas, on the Right of His Serene Highness, which had been placed there for him by special Command; and the Master of the Ceremonies, with His Serene Highness's Gentleman of Honor, and the other Officers, stood near the Person of the Bridegroom.

The Lord Chamberlain, Vice Chamberlain, with a Herald, and Drums and Trumpets, returned to attend the Bride; the Senior Herald remaining in the Chapel to conduct the several Persons to their respective Places.
