ON the 30th of April last we captured the French  
Brigantine Privateer Le Bafque, of Eight Guns  
and Fifty Men.

BE pleased to acquaint their Lordships, that on the  
Night of the 16th Instant, at Ten o'Clock, I  
received Intelligence of a French Privateer having  
captured a Brig, close to the Smalls, the Day before;  
in consequence of which I sailed the next Morning  
in Search of her, and have the Pleasure to say I re-  
took the Brig, and shortly afterwards took the Pri-  
vateer this Morning, about Six or Seven Miles from  
the Saltees, near Waterford.

The Privateer is a small Lugger, named L'Espeigle,  
mounting Four Carriage Guns, with Thirty-six Men.

plement 100 Men; but had thrown most of her  
Guns overboard in Chace.

That Almighty God, the Father of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, may protect your Royal Person, direct your Councils, prolong your Days,

and prosper your Administration: That the Divine Favour may ever attend your Royal Consort, the Prince and Princess of Wales, and all the Royal Family; and that, after reigning long on Earth with Wisdom and Felicity over a free, loyal and happy People, you may ascend to those Realms where pious and virtuous Princes inherit an unfading Crown, are the earnest Prayers of,

And as by an Act of Parliament passed in the Thirty-fifth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for establishing a more easy and expeditious Method for the Payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy," it is enacted by the 22th Clause of the said Act, "That if any Commissioned or War-
