THIS Day his Grace the Duke of Portland, Chancellor of the University of Oxford, the Rev. Dr. Budmore, Vice-Chancellor, the Rev. Mr. Maire and the Rev. Mr. Illingworth, Proctors; Dr. Wills, Warden of Wadham, Dr. Hodson, the Principal of Hartford, Dr. Pegge, Reader in Anatomy, Dr. Hughes, Mr. Jackson, Mr. Blackstone, Mr. Le Mesurier, and Mr. Vaughan, being the Delegates appointed by the University to attend on this Occasion, accompanied by a very considerable Number of Noblemen, Prelates, and Gentlemen, who were educated at that University, presented the following Address of Congratulation upon the Marriage of Her Royal Highness the Princess Royal with His Serene Highness the Hereditary Prince of Wirtemberg.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Chancellor, Masters and Scholars of the University of Oxford, beg Leave to approach your Throne with our unfeigned Congratulations on the auspicious Nuptials of your Majesty's eldest Daughter, the Princess Royal of England, with His Serene Highness the Hereditary Prince of Wirtemberg. The Adoption of an Alliance with a Protestant Prince of so illustrious a Race is an additional Proof of your Majesty's Zeal and Regard for that Religion, which has been so long and so happily established among us; and we most devoutly wish that it may be productive of the greatest Comfort to your Majesty, and Happiness to the Prince and Princess.

We gladly embrace this and every Opportunity afforded us of renewing our most grateful Acknowledgments to your Majesty for the many Blessings we enjoy under your fatherly Protection, and of pro-

fessing the warmest and most affectionate Attachment to your Majesty's Person, Family and Government; and we cease not to implore the Divine Goodness to continue to your Majesty the uninterrupted Possession of the Hearts of your People, to frustrate the Designs of your Enemies, and to perpetuate the Felicity and Splendor of your Reign.

Given at our House of Convocation this 19th Day of May, in the Year of our Lord 1797.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following most gracious Answer:

I Return you My Thanks for your Congratulations upon the Marriage of My Daughter with the Hereditary Prince of Wirtemberg. Your Expressions of Attachment to My Person, Family and Government, and your Regard for Our Holy Religion, as by Law established, are highly acceptable to Me, and cannot fail of securing to you the Continuance of My Favor and Protection.

ENCLOSED herewith is a Copy of a Letter I have received from Lieutenant Compton, commanding His Majesty's Brig Pilote, which you will be pleased to lay before their Lordships.

Pilote, off Beachy Head, May 26, 1797.

S I R,

I Have to acquaint you, that in following your Orders, after seeing the Convoy in Safety within the Buys at St. Helen's, I fell in with and captured, 10 Leagues S. S. E. from Beachy Head, L'Justine Adelaide, French Lugger Privateer, mounting Two Carriage Guns, Two Swivels, a Chest of Small Arms, and manned with 20 Men; Three Days from Encampment, without making a Capture.
