cof any of the Territories of the United States of America, which shall be imported directly from thence into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, in Manner above-mentioned, may, upon the Importer paying down, in ready Money, the Duty of Eight-pence the Hundred Weight, being Part of the Duties now payable on the Importation of Rice, be landed and warehoused (except as hereinaster excepted) under His Majefty's Locks, in fuch Warehoufes as shall be approved of for that Purpose by the Commisfioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms, or any Four or more of them, upon the Importer's own Bond for Payment of the Remainder of the Duties due and payable for fuch Rice, within Eighteen Months, according to the net Weight and Quantity of fuch Rice at the Time it shall be so landed : But it is His Majefty's Pleasure neverthelefs, that upon the Importation of any fuch Rice into the Ports of London, Briftol, Portfmouth, Cowes, Liverpool, Lancaster, Falmouth, Pool, Whitehaven, Hull, Greenock, and Port Glafgow, or either of them, in the Manner herein before expressed, the Importer shall be at Liberty to enter and land the fame without Payment of any Duty whatever; in which Cafe fuch Rice shall be warehoused, under the joint Locks of His Majefly and the Proprietors, in fuch Warehoufe or Warehoufes as shall be approved of for that Purpose by the Commissioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms, or any Four or more of them, in that Part of Great Britain celled England, and any Three or more of them, in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland; every Expence attending which Warehousing shall be borne by the faid Proprietors: And that fuch Proprietor or Proprietors, or his or their known Agent, shall from Time to Time, at all seasonable Hours, as Occasion may require, have free Access to fuch Warehouses, in the Presence of fome proper Officer of the Cuftoms, for the Purpole of fkreening and thifting the Rice, to prevent it's receiving Damage. And that if any Rice, which shall be fo imported from the Territories of the faid United States into any of the Ports abovementioned refpectively, and warehoused as aforefaid, shall be taken out of the Warehouses wherein the same shall be fecured, under the joint Locks of His Majesty and the Proprietors as aforefaid, for Home Confumption, the full Duties, due and payable by Law upon the Importation of fuch Rice into this Kingdom for Home Confumption, shall, previously to it's being taken out of fuch Warehoufes, be paid to the Col--lector of His Majefty's Cuftoms at the Ports where fuch Rice shall be fo warehoused ; but that such Proprietor, if he intends to export fuch Rice, shall have Liberty to export the fame from fuch Warehoufes respectively, under the usual Regulations, without

Duty, any Rice, being the Growth or Production | Payment of any Duty whatever : Provided that the Exportation of any fuch Rice, hereafter to be warehoused, be made within the faid Space of Eighteen Months; and if not within that Period, that the full Duties, payable by Law upon the Importation of fuch Rice, be paid for the fame, and not be afterwards drawn back : And that if any Rice which shall have been imported into any Port of this Kingdom, not herein before specially named, and shall have been warehoused upon the Importer's Bond, in Manner aforefaid, shall, within the Time herein before mentioned, be taken out of the Warehouse wherein it shall have been to fecured, to be exported directly from thence, the Bond entered into for the Payment of the faid Duties thereon fhall be difcharged and cancelled by Debenture or Debentures, made out and passed in the usual Manner, for the Quantity or Quantities of Rice duly exported. And if any Rice imported into any Port of this Kingdom, not herein before fpecially named, and warehoused in Manner aforesaid, shall be taken out of any fuch Warehouse for Home Consumption, the Remainder of the Duties, due and payable by Law, shall, previously to it's being taken out of fuch Warehouse, be paid to the Collector of His Majefty's Cuftoms at the Port where fuch Rice shall be fo warehoused; and that such Payment shall be made, and the Warehouse cleared for such Rice hereafter to be warehoused, within the faid Space of Eighteen Months, otherwife the fame shall and may be fold for the Duties, in like Manner, and under the fame Rules, Regulations and Reftrictions, as any other Goods are now directed by Law to be fold for the Duties.
