W E, your Majefly's most dutiful and loyal Sub-jects, the antient Body Corporate of the Seamen of England, humbly beg Leave to approach your Majefty, to express the deep Concern, which, in com-mon with all your Majefty's faithful Subjects, we feel at the prefent difgraceful Conduct of fome of the Seamen of your Majesty's Fleet, who, instigated, no Doubt, by the wicked Infinuations of some evildisposed Persons, Enemies alike to your Majesty's Royal Perfon and to their Country, have been be-trayed into Acts of Infubordination and Outrage, degrading to the Character of British Seamen, hitherto as highly diffinguished for Loyalty and good Conduct, as for Intrepidity in vanquishing their Enemies : Impelled, therefore, by the Duty we owe to your Majesty and to our Country, we step forward, at this alarming Crisis, to declare our Readiness to support, with our Lives, such Measures as your Majesty, in your Wisdom, may think most expedient to adopt for the Reftoration of good Order and Subordination among the Seamen of your Majefty's Fleet.
