The KING's Most Excellent Majesty
in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled, " An Act for more effectually
" restraining Intercourse with the Crews
" of certain of His Majesty's Ships,
" now in a State of Mutiny and Rebel-
" lion, and for the more effectual Sup-
" pression of such Mutiny and Rebel-
" lion;" it is enacted, That it shall be
lawful for the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, or any Three or more of them, being thereto authorized by Order of His Majesty in Council, to declare the Crew of any of His Majesty's Ships, who have been guilty of Acts of Mutiny and Rebellion, and who still persist therein; and also the Crew of any other of His Ma-

jefty's Ships, who shall be guilty of any of the like Offences, to be in a State of Mutiny and Rebellion; and by such Declaration to warn all His Majesty's faithful Subjects to abstain from all Communication or Intercourse with the Crews of the said Ships: And it is further enacted; that it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, or any Three or more of them; in such Manner as His Majesty shall authorize and require, to accept the Submission of the Crew of any Ship which shall have been so declared to be in a State of Mutiny and Rebellion, or of any Person or Persons, Part of such Crew; or of any Person or Persons on Board of any of such Ships, or to declare any such Person or Persons to have returned to their Duty, and thereupon to declare the Person or Persons, whose Submission shall be so accepted, or who shall be so declared to have returned to their Duty, to be exempted and relieved from all or any of the Penalties and Forfeiture
