of this Kingdom any of the Wood called Lignum | Treafury, the Commissioners for executing the Office Vitæ, will expire upon the 10th Day of this initiant June : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the taid Provibition should be continued for fome Time longer; His M jefty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command; that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do; at any Time, for the Space of Six Months; to commence from the faid 10 h Day of this inflant June, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry or convey, or lade or lay on Board of any Ship, Vellel or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried or conveyed out of this Kingdom, an. of the Wood called ligtum Vite, without Leave or Permifion being fift had and ob tained from His Majetty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majett,'s Reign, intituled, " An Act for indemnifying all " Perfons who have been concerned in adviling " or carrying into Execution an Order of the Lords " Commiffioners of His Majeity's Treafury refpect-" ing the Exportation of Pot-Affies or Pearl-Affies; " for preventing Suits in confequence of the fame; " for authorizing His Majelly to prohibit the Ex-" portation or carrying Coaffwife of Pot-Afhes or " Pearl-Affies, and for making further Provisions relative thereto." But it is nevertheles His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained fliall extend, or be confirmed to extend; to prevent any Ship or Vellel from taking or having on Board any of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ which may be neceffary for the Ule of the faid Ship or Veffel during the Courfe of her intended Voyage; nor to prevent the Exportation of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to Ireland, or to His Majefly's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majefly's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's For's and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Ifland of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid Wood called Lignum-Vitæ to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Iflands of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, or to His Majefty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the Weft Indies, or to the Ifland of New-foundland, or to His Majetty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of Sr. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the faid Wood called Lignum. Vitæ do first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which it shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the fame fhail be made, and do give full and fufficient Se-curity, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majefty's Cuttoms, to carry the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to the Places for which it is fo entered Outwards, and none other; and fuch Bond fhall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commiffioners, shewing that the faid Wood called Lignum-Vitæ has been duly landed at the Places for which it was entered Outwards.—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's
