racter of British Seamen, hitherto as highly diffinguished for Loyalty and good Conduct, as for Intredity in vanquishing their Enemies.

Impelled therefore by our Duty to your Majefty and to our Country, we step forward at this alarm-ing Crisis, to manifest at once our just Abhorrence of the atrocious Conduct of the deluded Seamen, (notwithstanding your Majesty's gracious Admonition to them) and our warm Admiration of the confirmed Loyalty of your Majesty's Troops, so evident by their public Declarations and exemplary Conduct, and to avow our Readinefs, refiding in the first Port of the Kingdom, to support with our Lives such Measures as your Majesty in your Wildom may deem most expedient to adopt for the Restoration of good Order and Subordination among the Scamen of your Majesty's Fleet, for the Honour, Dignity and Welfare of our Country.
