

Extract of a Letter from Vice-Admiral King fmill, Commander in Chief of His Majefty's Ships and Veffels at Cork, to Evan Nepean, Efg; dated on Board His Majesty's Ship L'Engageante, Cork Harbour, July 1, 1797.

STR.

PLEASE to inform my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that His Majelly's Ship Galatea has just brought in L'Argonaute French Lugger Privateer, mounting 2 Brafs Six-Pounders, 10 Swivels, and 36 Men; Fourteen Days out from Granville.

Captain Byng acquaints me this Lugger is quite new; had not made any Prize; that he captured her Yeflerday between Cape Clear and Scilly, and that Twelve Days ago fhe had been chafed by a Frigate and Three Cutters Three Leagues from the Lizard, but escaped under the Isle of Bas.

Copy of a Letter from Mr. Munnings, Commander of the Repulse Revenue Cutter, to the Collector and Comptroller of Colchefter, dated June 28, 1797.

Gentlemen,

BEING on a Cruiz: off Orfordness Yesterday at Three P. M. fell in with and gave Chace to a French Lugger Privateer; at Six P. M. she struck her Colours, after attempting to board us : She proves to be the Tyger, of Dunkirk, commanded by Lewis Augustin Buen Chatening, with 2 Two-Pounders, 4 Swivels and Small Arms, and 28 Men, Burthen 30 Tons, which I have just arrived here with, and am waiting for a Party of Soldiers to efcort them to Colcheiter. She had been only Tcn Hours from -Oftend.

Copy of a Letter from Mr. Robert Adams, Com-mander of the Viper Excise Cutter, to Evan Nepean, Ejq; dated at Hurwich, July 5, 1797-SIR.

I Have the Honour to inform you, that the Viper Cutter, under my Command, being on a Cruize on the zd Instant, at One P. M. after a Chace of Two Hours, captured on the Shore near Clackton, in the Wallet, Les Graces, French Lugger Privateer, mounting 1 Two-Pounder and Two Swivels, in Carriages, which were thrown overboard in the Chacc, the Small Arms remain on Board. Les Graces failed from Dunkirk on the 1st Instant, under the Command of Guillaume Gaspard Malo, and Twenty-two Men. and had taken nothing. The Enemy fled into the Country immediately on their landing, but being purfued by the Cutter's Crew, af-fifted to the utmost by the Inhabitants and Troops on the Coaft, the French Commander, with Twenty of his Crew, were fecured, and are now fafely lodged in the Prifon at this Place.

His Majesty, by His Royal Letters, having been pleased to appoint Edmond Henry Baron Glentworth to be of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council of Ireland, he this Day in Council took the usual Oaths and his Place at the Board accordingly.

Dublin Caftle, July 3, 1797.

THIS Day his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant went in State to the Houfe of Peers, and being feated on the Throne with the ufual Solemnity, Mr. Bryan Connor, Yeoman Ufher of the Black Rod, was fent with a Meffage from his Excellency to the Houfe of Commons, fignifying his Pleafure that they fhould immediately attend his Excellency in the Houfe of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, his Excellency gave the Royal Affent to

An Act to enable His Majefty to grant a certain Penfion to the Princefs Royal upon her intended Marriage with the Hereditary Prince of Wirtembergh.

An Act for further extending the Provisions of an Act, passed in the Twenty-first and Twenty-second Years of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act for establishing a Bank, by the Name of the Governor and Company of the Bank of Ireland.

An Act to enable the Proprietors of Debentures issued by Government, to convert them into Stock, transferable at the Bank of Ireland.

An Act for confirming and continuing, for a limited Time, the Restrictions contained in the Minute of Council of the Second Day of March, One Thonfand Seven Hundred and Ninety-seven, on Payments in Cash by the Bank.

An Act for regulating the iffuing of Licences for the Sale of Wine, Ale, Beer, Cider and Spirituous Liquors by Retail, and for preventing the immoderate Use of Spirituous Liquors.

An Act to regulate the Trade of rectifying of Spirits, and to subject Distillers to certain Regulations therein mentioned.

An Act for directing the Application of the Sum of Five Thousand Five Hundred Pounds, granted by Parliament to the Dublin Society for the Improvement of Husbandry and other useful Arts.

An Act for granting to the Commissioners for making wide and convenient Streets in Dublin the Sums therein mentioned, for the Purpofes therein mentioned.

An Act to amend an Act, paffed in the Thirtieth Year of His prefent Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act for the Improvement of the Port and Harbour of Drogheda, and the better Regulation of the Police of faid Town.

An Act to enable His Majesty to grant an Annuity to certain Truttees therein named, in Trutt for Alicia Knipe, Widow of the Reverend George Knipe, deceased, and for the Children of the faid George Knipe, namely, John, George, Frances and Anne.

An Act for the better Prevention and Punishment of Attempts to seduce Persons serving in His Majesty's Forces by Sea or Land from their Duty and Allegiance to His Majesty, or to incite them to Mutiny or Disobedience.

An Act to explain an Act, passed in the Thirtyfixth Year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act more effectually to suppress Insurrections and prevent the Disturbance of the Public Peace.

An Act for indemnifying fuch Perfons as have acted, fince the Firft Day of January, One Thoufand Seven Hundred and Ninety-feven, for the Prefervation of the Public Peace, and Suppression of the Infurrections prevailing in fome Parts of this Kingdom.

An Act for the further Regulation of the Election of Members to ferve in Parliament.

An Act for the Relief of confined Debtors who may be infolvent.

An Act for the Relief and Maintenance of Infolvent Debtors detained in Prifon.

An Act for the Relief of Perfons who have omitted to qualify themfelves according to Law.

An Act for the further Regulation of the Linen and Hempen Manufactures.

An Act for amending and reducing into one Act of Parliament the Laws relating to Hackney and other Carriages plying in the City of Dublin, in Suburbs and Liberties, and within Seven Miles thereof.

An Act to explain and amend an Act paffed in the Twenty-feventh Year of His prefent Majefty, entitled, An Act for improving and repairing the Turnpike Road leading from the City of Dublin to Kilcullen Bridge in the County of Kildare, and to the Twenty-one Mile-Stone, Westward of the faid Bridge.

His Excellency was then pleafed to make the following Speech:

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

Have the Satisfaction of being at length enabled to relieve you from your laborious Attendance in Parliament; and am commanded by His Majefty to express the just Sense he entertains of that firm Temper and vigorous Determination which you have uniformly manifested in supporting His Majesty's Government, and protecting our happy Constitution from the Attempts of every Foreign and Domestic Enemy.

I have much Pleafure in announcing to you that the British Parliament has passed Acts for abolishing the Bounty on Sail-Cloth exported to Ireland, and for prohibiting the Importation of Cambrick from all Countries except this Kingdom.

Gentlemen of the Houfe of Commons,

I am to thank you, in His Majefty's Name, for your Unanimity in voting the extraordinary Supplies which the Public Exigencies demanded. However unprecedented those Supplies have been in Extent, and however difficult they may have been rendered from the State of Public Credit, you have wifely attended to the fuperior Confideration of national Safety. Such an Exertion is the fureff Proof that you are truly fensible of the invaluable Bleffings which we are contending to preferve; and that the beft Means of effecting an honourable Peace, and of reftoring all the Comforts of Tranquillity, are by dilplaying at once your Determination and your Power, and by convincing your Enemies of the Extent of your Refources as well as of the Steadiness of your Courage.

The ready Affiftance which has been received from the Sifter Kingdom in facilitating the Loan of the Year, whilft it is a fure Demonstration of her feiendly Cordiality, cannot fail to fhew how infeparable are the mutual Interests of the Two Kingdoms, and how necessfary their Connexion is for their mutual Profperity.

Your Humanity in directing your Attention to the prefent Diffress among the Manufacturers, does not lefs command my Approbation than your Prudence in the Mode of conveying Relief, by increating the Means of their Employment.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

The Powers with which you intrufted me, by the Sufpension of the Habeas Corpus Act, have enabled me to bring to Light and to difconcert the formidable and fecret Confpiracy which had been formed for the total Overthrow of your Establishments, the Destruction of Property, and the Diffolution of Government. This Confpiracy has been to fully unfolded by your Wifdom, that it can no longer Ipread itself under the infidious Pretence which it had artfully affumed of improving the Conftitution. In the Meafures, whether of Vigilance or of Coercion, which you have recommended for it's Extinction, I fhall not relax. It will be my Study to temper the neceffary Acts of Severity and Rigour by conciliatory Offers of Clemency and Pardon; to exhort the Infatuated and Deluded to abandon their Deceivers, and to fummon the Guilty to Repentance; but at the fame Time it is, and will be my fixed Purpole, to proceed with Vigour against those, who, regardless of every Warning and Admonition, shall continue their desperate Efforts to involve this flourishing Country in all the Horrors of Infurrection and Invation, of Bloodshed, and of Anarchy.

I have already the Satisfaction to acquaint you, that great Numbers, who had been unfortunately feduced, have returned to a Senfe of Duty, and been admitted to His Majelty's Clemency; and I trust that, by Perfeverance and Energy, every Vestige of Disaffection will be effaced, and univerfally give Way to the Return of that Spirit of Loyalty, which has so long been the distinguishing Characteristic of this Kingdom.

I cannot omit to congratulate with you on the unimpaired Luftre of that Spirit, which fo confpicuoufly fhone forth when the Enemy's Fleet appeared on our Coafts; nor can I too often repeat my full-Senfe of your Wifdom in the Eftablifhment of Diftrict Corps. I have the molt fatisfactory Accounts of their Improvement in Difcipline, as well as of their Exertions in quelling and preventing Infurrection; and I have myfelf witneffed the unexampled Exertions, good Conduct, and Military Appearance of the Corps of the Metropolis; whofe unceafing and unwearied Vigilance, at a moft important Crifis checked every Attempt to produce Confusion by Riotand Tumult, at the fame Time that it deftroyed the Hopes of our Enemies, reftored Confidence to the Country in general.

Your judicious Augmentation of Pay to His Majelty's Regular and Militia Forces, which muft render their Situation fo highly comfortable, is at once a feafonable and honourable Acknowledgement of their Steadinefs and Loyalty. The traitorous Efforts, which have been made to entice them from their Allegiance, have had a fatal Effect in a few lamentable Examples. I truft, however, they have excited in the Minds of others fo timely a Repentance, and in the reft fuch Indignation and Abhorrence, that no future Danger can be apprehended,

Your wife Inftitution of a Sinking Fund, in the Midft of financial Difficulties, cannot be too much applauded, and will prevent any ruinous Depreciation of funded Stock; and, being established before the National Debts has accumulated to any oppreffive Magnitude, will tend to prevent its becoming dangerous: A Measure fo truly calculated for preferving the Refources of the State, and supporting Public Credit, must fecure to you the Gratitude of an enlightened People.

His Majely is exerting every proper Effort to produce a fpeedy and fecure Peace. It will be our Duty to affift those Efforts, by convincing our Enemies, from the State of our Preparation, and the Unanimity of our Spirit, that they can hope for no Advantage by prolonging the Calamities of War.

Wherever your Abilities, your Influence and Exertions can be most advantageoufly employed on your Return to your feveral Counties, I am confident they will be most confpicuoufly displayed. A conflant Intercourfe with your immediate Neighbourhoods must give you the Opportunity of affording to the People both Affistance and Example, of reclaiming the Deluded and III-disposed, and confirming the Well-affected in their Fidelity and Allegiance. A forwaad Spirit of Loyalty, which, in most Parts of the Kingdom, has fuccefsfully checked the Progress of Treason, will be firengtened and diffused by your Prefence and Exertions. It will be my Ambition to fecond your Activity and Zeal, and to co-operate with your Efforts for reftoring the Tranquillity and Prosperity of the Kingdom.

We have a common and facred Caufe to defend, the Independence and Confliction of Great Britain and Ireland, from which both Kingdoms have derived innumerable Bleffings under His Majefty's aufpicious Reign. They were purchafed by the deareft Blood of your Anceftors in a Crifis not lefs formidable than the prefent. I truft we fhall not fail to imitate their great Example, and that we fhall be enabled, by fimilar Courage and continued Firmnefs, to tranfinit to our Pofterity inviolate that invaluable Inheritance, which their Valour refcued, and their Perfeverence preferved.
