Wheat-Meal or Flour, Rye, Barley or Malt, or Bread, Bifcuit or Peas, to the Islands of Guernfey, Jersey and Alderney, for the Suftenance and Ufe of the Inhabitants of the faid Iflands, for a limited Time.

An Act to make perpetual an Act passed in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His late Majefty, intituled, An Act to prevent the committing of Frauds by Bankrupts.

An Act to amend an Act made in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for the Encouragement of Seamen, and for the better and more effectually mapning His Ma. jefty's Navy, and for making further Provision for those Purposes.

An Act to repeal fo much of an Act made in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His late Majefty King George the Second, intituled, An Act for the more eafy Recovery of Debts in His Majefty's Plantations and Colonies in America, as makes Negroes Chattels for the Payment of Debts.

An Act for regulating the Height between Decks of Veffels entered Outwards for the Purpose of carrying Slaves from the Coaft of Africa.

An Act further to continue an Act made in this present Seffion of Parliament, intituled, An Act to fulpend, for a limited Time, the Operation of Two Acts of the Fifteenth and Seventeenth Years of the Reign of His Majefty for reftraining the Negotia-tion of Promiflory Notes and Inland Bills of Ex-change, under a limited Sum, within that Part of Great Britain called England, as revived, amended and continued by a subsequent Act of this Session, paffed for the Purpole of reviving, amending and continuing the fame, and alfo for continuing fuch fubsequent Act.

An Act to explain an Act passed in the Thirtyfifth Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, intituled, An A& for further encouraging and regulating the Southern Whale Fisheries.

An Act for more effectually preventing the administering or taking of unlawful Oaths.

An Act to shorten the Time new required for giving Notice of the Royal Intention of His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, that the Parliament shall meet and be holden for the Dispatch of Businefs; and more effectually to provide for the Meeting of Parliament in the Cafe of a Demife of the Crown,

An Act for the Relief of certain Infolvent Debtors. An Act for affeffing the Commiffioners of the Tax Office and their Officers to the Land Tax, in the District called Offices executed in Westminster Hall, notwithstanding the Removal of the faid Tax Office into Somerfet Place.

An Act for enlarging, deepening, improving and maintaining the Harbonr of Saltcoats in the County of Ayr.

An Act for difcontinuing the New Harbour of Rye, in the County of Suffex, and for repealing feveral Acts relating thereto; and for providing for the Discharge of a Debt accrued on Account thereof, and for making Reparation for certain Losses, and for the Improvement of the Old Harbour of Rye.

An Act for supplying the Borough and Town of Weymouth and Melcombe Regis, and the Parts adjacent, in the County of Dorfet, with Water.

An Act for building a Bridge over Burfledon fons w River, at or near the Ferry at Burfledon, in the in that County of Southampton; and for making a Road Time.

from the intended Bridge over the River Itchin, at or near Northam, within the Liberties of the Town and County of the Town of Southampton, to the faid Bridge, and from thence to Tichfield in the faid County of Southampton.

. An Act for amending, altering, improving and keeping in Repair, the Road leading from the Town of Cambridge into the Old North Road near Arrington Bridge, all in the County of Cambridge.

Westminster, Jaly 20, 1797.
