P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-fifth of January last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Twenty-fifth Day of this instant July: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the said Twenty-fifth Day of this instant July, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or ship or lade any of the Articles above mentioned on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission being first had, and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act, passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Exportation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms and Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in

" Council." But it is, nevertheless, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Boats, in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance; or by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on Board such Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of such Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the said several Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the said Articles, for the Purposes of Trade, to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of such Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient security by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are so entered Outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up, until Proof be made, to the Satisfaction

tion of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been duly landed at the Places for which they were entered Outwards. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

Copy of a Letter from Captain Honeyman, Commander of His Majesty's Sloop Tisiphone, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated July 23, 1797.

S I R,

I Have the Honor of stating to you, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that having been ordered by Admiral Duncan to take His Majesty's Brig Rambler under my Command, and cruize on the Dogger Bank, I Yesterday, at Five A.M. in the Latitude of 54 deg. 30 min. the Rambler in Company, fell in with and captured, after a Chace of Half an Hour, Le Prospère, French Privateer Brig, mounting 14 Four-Pounders, and manned with 73 Men; Four Days from Dunkirk, without capturing any thing. She received the Fire of several of our Guns, and struck without making any Resistance.

In consequence of the Number of Prisoners, I have thought it proper to proceed to the nearest Port to land them, and, after having so done, I shall proceed with all possible Dispatch to my Station.

S I R,

YOU will be pleased to inform their Lordships, that the Duke of York Lugger returned last Night. She fell in with a French Lugger Privateer, and chased her off the Land into the Hands of Lieutenant Bray, commanding the Hind Revenue Cutter, who also retook a Sloop, which the Privateer had before captured: The Lugger mounts 2 Guns, with 25 Men.

Extract of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Kingsmill, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships at Cork, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated July 20, 1797.

PLEASE to inform my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that His Majesty's Ship Magnanime arrived here last Night, and has brought in a fast-sailing coppered Ship Privateer the Triton, of which a further Account is given in the enclosed Letter to me from the Hon. Captain De Courcy.

Magnanime, at Sea, July 17, 1797.

S I R,

Cruising Seventy Leagues Westward of Cape Clear, in compliance with your Instructions of the 22d Ult. His Majesty's Ship the Magnanime, under my Command, amidst thick and stormy Weather, fell in with and captured Le Triton, a French Privateer, Nineteen Days from Nantz, pierced for 18 Guns, though only mounting 8 Twelve-Pounders, and manned with 180 Men. Upon her Cruize she appears to have taken One American Schooner.

Copy of a Letter from Mr. Richard Johns, jun. commanding the Dolphin Revenue Cutter, to Mr. Nepean, dated Marazion, July 20, 1797.

S I R,

I Have the Pleasure to inform you, that from Information I received Yesterday Morning from the Captain of a Sloop, of his being chased in here by a French Privateer, I immediately slipped my Cable and went in Pursuit of her, and in the Course of Six Hours came up with and captured the Privateer La Papillon, Captain Thomas Franerie, Lieutenant de Vaisseau, mounting 4 Swivels and Plenty of Small Arms, with 30 Men, out Four Days from Brest; had recaptured, the Evening before, the St. Anne Chasse Marée, with Wine from Nantz, bound to Brest, John Acalré, Master; which Chasse-Marée was first captured by the Squadron under the Command of Sir John Borlase Warren.

THE Commissioners for carrying into Effect the Sixth Article of the Treaty of Amity, Commerce and Navigation, concluded between His Britannic Majesty and the United States of America, on the 19th Day of November, 1794, having this Day constituted their Board, pursuant and agreeably to the said Treaty, do hereby give Notice, that they are ready to proceed to Business accordingly; and they desire that all Claims under the said Article, (which so far as the same describes the Cases thereby provided for is hereunto annexed) may be lodged with their Secretary without Delay.

They further desire that all such Claims may not only state in what Manner the several Cases come within the Description of the said Article, but also, specially set forth the Nature of the Evidence by which the Claimants respectively undertake to substantiate the same.

EXTRACT FROM THE SAID ARTICLE.

"Whereas it is alleged by divers British Merchants and others, His Majesty's Subjects, that Debts to a considerable Amount, which were bona fide contracted before the Peace, still remain owing to them by Citizens or Inhabitants of the United States; and that, by the Operation of various lawful Impediments since the Peace, not only the full Recovery of the said Debts has been delayed, but also the Value and Security thereof have been in several Instances impaired and lessened; so that, by the ordinary Course of judicial Proceedings, the British Creditors cannot now obtain and actually have and receive full and adequate Compensation for the Losses and Damages which they have thereby sustained: It is agreed that in all such Cases, where full Compensation for such Losses and Damages cannot, for whatever Reason, be actually obtained,

had and received by the said Creditors, in the ordinary Course of Justice, the United States will make full and complete Compensation for the same to the said Creditors; but it is distinctly understood that this Provision is to extend to such Losses only as have been occasioned by the lawful Impediments aforesaid, and is not to extend to Losses occasioned by such Insolvency of the Debtors, or other Causes, as would equally have operated to produce such Loss, if the said Impediments had not existed; nor to such Losses or Damages as have been occasioned by the manifest Delay or Negligence, or wilful Omission of the Claimant."
