" than you imagine Mr. Parker has Friends
" and more of them than you are aware of who will
" not suffer you to escape; and in such an Hour as
" you think not it will come upon you even sudden
" destruction thank God all your diabolical Malice
" is now terminated with respect unto him, he is
" we hope where such infernal villains as you can
" never enter for hell is made for such base abominable
" miscreants and such as your vile Captain
" and Barry and yourself are vessels of wrath fitted
" to everlasting destruction o how will it gail your
" souls thro' all Eternity to See Blessed Parker full
" of Joy and happiness and Glory in the blissful
" presence of God and Christ and Holy Angels,
" when you will be company to devils and damned

" Souls, and full of wrath, Misery and Wee for
" ever and ever.—We are &c. &c. &c."

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in writing and sending the Letter above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any of them, (except the Person who actually wrote the said Letter) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
