PROCLAMATION,

For giving Currency to a new Coinage of Copper Money of One Penny and Two Penny Pièces.

GEORGE R.

7HEREAS in confequence of the unanimous Addrefs of Our Commons of Great Britain, in Parliament assembled, praying that We would be gracioufly pleafed to give Directions that Meafures might be taken for an immediate Supply of fuch Copper Coinage vas might be beit adapted to the Payment of the Laborious Poor in the prefent Exigency; We have thought fit to order, that certain Pieces of Copper should be coined, which should go and pass for One Penny and Two Pennies, and that each of such Pieces of One Penny should weigh One Ounce Avoirdupois, and that each of fuch Two Penny Pieces should weigh Two Ounces Avoirdu-pois; the intrinsfic Value of such Pieces of One Penny and Two Pennies, Workmanship included, correfponding as nearly as pollible with the nominal Value of the fame refpectively; every fuch Piece having, on one Side thereof, Our Effigies or Por-traiture, with Our Name or Title, and on the Reverse, the Figure of Britannia, represented fitting on a Rock in the Sea, holding a Trident in her Left Hand, and a Branch of Olive in her Right Hand, with the Year of our Lord .- And whereas Penny and Two Penny Pieces of Copper, of the Weight and Defcription aforefaid, have been coined, and will be foon ready for Delivery, according to the Orders which We have given for that Purpofe: We have therefore, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, thought fit to iffue this Our Royal Procla-mation, and We do hereby ordain, declare and command, that the faid Pieces of Copper Money, fo coined as aforefaid, fhall be current and lawful Money of Our Kingdom of Great Britain, and fhall pais and be received as current and lawful Money of

[Price One Shilling and Six-pence.]

Our faid Kingdom; that is to fay, fuch Penny Pieces as of the Value of One Penny, and fuch Two Penny Pieces as of the Value of Two Pennies, in all Payments and Transactions of Money; provided that no Perfon shall be obliged to take more of fuch Copper Money in any one Payment, than shall be of the Value of One Shilling, after the Rate aforefaid.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twentyfixth Day of July, One thousand feven hundred and ninety-feven, in the Thirty-feventh Year of Our Reign.

Addrefs of His Majefty's Conful and the Members of the Britifh Factory at Leghorn to the Honourable William Frederick Wyndham, His Majefty's Envoy Extraordinary at the Court of Florence, published at the Request of the Factory.

SIR, Leghorn, July 4, 1797. WE, the Conful and Members of the British Factory of Leghorn, being returned to our Place of Refidence, and for the first Time legally affembled, embrace with Pleafure the earlieft Opportunity to express our grateful Acknowledgments to you, Sir, for the kind Concern you have ever been pleafed to fhew towards our Welfare and Profperity. But we feel ourfelves more particularly called upon to mark our Gratitude for the Zeal and Activity you difplayed laft Year in difcovering and communicating to us the execrable Intentions of the French Army to violate the Neutrality of Tuscany, and feize upon the Property, as well of the English Nation as of the English Individuals in this Place. To your Advice, Sir, and to that alone, is due the Merit of faving all the English Merchantmen in our Port, befides the Property embarked on these and other Vessels, making in all a Convoy of Forty-nine Sail, that de-parted from hence for Corfica on the 27th of June laft Year : And had it not been for a Notification of the

the Government of this City, published only Forty Hours before the Entrance of the French Troops, declaring that the Rumours spread of their coming here were falfe, and informing the Inhabitants in general of it's having had Miniferial Affurances that the Neutrality of Tufcany would be refpected, much more would have been faved .: But confidering the Force of the faid Notification, which kept People in Suspence until it was too late, by the rapid Ap-proach of the Enemy, and the Confusion incident to fo extraordinary and unpreedented a Cafe, it was to be rather wondered at that fo much was done in the fhort Space of Sixty Hours, including the Jews and Christian Sabbath.

To commemorate the Epoch of these eminent Services and our Obligations and Gratitude, we have defired one of our Members, now in London, to get a Piece of Plate prepared, with an Infcription engraved upon it fuitable to the Purpole and Occasion, and whereof we shall, in due Time, request your Acceptance.

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in writing and sending the Letter above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any of them, (except the Person who astually wrote the said Letter) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

full Compensation for such Losses and Damages cannot, for whatever Reason, be actually obtained, had and received by the faid Creditors, in the ordinary Courfe of Juffice, the United States will make full and complete Compensation for the same to the faid Creditors; but it is diffinctly understood that this Provision is to extend to fuch Losses only as have been occafioned by the lawful Impediments aforefaid, and is not to extend to Losses occasioned by fuch Infolvency of the Debtors, or other Caufes, as would equally have operated to produce fuch Lofs; if the faid Impediments had not existed; nor to such Losses or Damages as have heen occasioned by the manifest Delay or Negligence, or wilful Omission of the Claimant."
