Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Kingmill, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels at Cork, to Ewan Nepean, Esq; dated the 13th of August, 1797.

S I R,

PLEASE to inform my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that His Majesty's Ship Santa Margaritta has captured and sent in La Victorine, a new French Schooner Privateer, which was occasionally sailed as a Lugger, and had, under each of these Denominations, before been chased by some of the Cruizers on this Station. For further Particulars I beg Leave to refer their Lordships to the inclosed Letter from Captain Parker.

Santa Margaritta, off Kinsale, August 12, 1797.

S I R,

HAVING received Information from a Vessel which I spoke on the 2d Instant, that she was boarded by a French Privateer in Latitude 50 deg. and Longitude 15 deg. West, I judged, for the Good of His Majesty's Service and Protection of the Trade, to intercept her, and made Sail for that Purpose to the Westward. On the 8th Instant, Cape Clear bearing N. 60 deg. E. distant 91 Leagues, I fell in with and captured La Victorine, French Schooner Privateer, belonging to Nantes, pierced for 16 Guns and manned with 82 Men; had taken the Somerfet, from the Bay of Honduras to London, and the John and Phœbe, American Ship, from Liverpool to New York. La Victorine is a very fine Vessel, quite new, well found, and is the same which the Unicorn chased off Cape Clear in her late Cruise.

S I R,

PLEASE to inform my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty that His Majesty's Ship Maganime has recaptured and sent in the Charlotte, of Liverpool, bound to New Brunswick, which was captured on the 2d Instant, in Latitude 47 deg. and Longitude 18 deg. West, by the Faon French Ship Privateer, of 16 Guns and 160 Men, and retaken on the 8th Instant; also the Neptune, belonging and bound to Greenock, laden with Birch and Coffee, from Nova Scotia, which had been captured on the 4th Instant, 100 Miles West of Tory Island, by Le Boulonnois French Cutter Privateer, and retaken on the 10th Instant, in Latitude 49 deg. and Longitude 12 deg. West.

Extract of a Letter from Captain Gunter, Commander of His Majesty's Sloop Nautilus, to Ewan Nepean, Esq; dated off the Scaw, the 2d of July, 1797.

I Proceeded off the Scaw with His Majesty's Sloop Nautilus and Sea-Gull, King George and Fox Cutters; and this Morning we were fortunate enough to fall in with and capture the D^r Klyne Sperwer Dutch Privateer, of 6 Guns and 28 Men; 20 of which escaped in the Boats before the Fox's Boat got on Board her. She has been out a Month from Amsterdam, had taken nothing, is armed with 6 Three-Pounders, Swivels, Musquets, &c.

From the Number of Privateers that I have good Information of, I am much in Hopes, in a few Days, we shall catch a few more of them.

S I R,

BE pleased to acquaint the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that, on the 3d Instant, cruising to the Southward of Shetland, I captured a Dutch Privateer Schooner, out of Rotterdam, called the *Unity*, of 10 Guns and 50 Men, with her Prizes, an English Ship and Brig, which she had taken off Buchanefs, and was carrying over to Norway.

Copy of a Letter from Captain Pearson, of His Majesty's Sloop *Stork*, dated off Scarborough, the 16th of August, 1797, to Ewan Nepean, Esq;

I Have to acquaint you, for the Information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that, on the Night of the 15th Instant, at Eleven P. M. in His Majesty's Sloop *Stork* under my Command, the Humber bearing West about Four Leagues, I fell in with, and, after a short Chace, captured *Le Lynx*, a French Lugger Privateer, of 14 Guns and 50 Men, belonging to Dunkirk; which Place she failed from on the 13th, and I am very happy to say had taken nothing.

Dublin-Castle, August 12, 1797.

This Day being the Anniversary of the Birth of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired Three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn up in the Royal Square at the Barracks. In the Evening a Play was given by his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant to the Ladies; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and every other Demonstration of Joy throughout the City.
