*Extract of a Letter from Captain James Boorder, Commander of His Majesty's Sloop Espeigle, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated in Yarmouth Roads the 20th of August, 1797.*

I Have the Honor to inform you, for the Information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that, agreeable to my Orders from Admiral Duncan of the 12th Instant, I was proceeding for Yarmouth Roads: On the 13th, at Six P.M. Yarmouth bearing W. S. W. Distance Seventy Miles, we fell in with a French Brig Privateer, and which, after a Chace of Twenty-four Hours, (running upwards of 197 Miles) we came within Pistol Shot of her. After firing One Broadside at her, she struck to His Majesty's Sloop under my Command; the Captain and First Lieutenant were killed, and Two Men wounded; I am happy to say I had only One Man slightly hurt in the Head.

She proves to be the Prodigy, from Dunkirk, out Twenty-eight Days; had made no Captures; pierced for 18 Guns, mounting 14, and had on Board 87 Men.

My Officers and Men behaved well; and I am confident, from their cool and steady Conduct, that had the Chase been superior, we should have given a good Account of her.

Enclosed herewith is a Copy of a Letter I have received from Mr. George Broad, commanding His Majesty's hired Lugger Resolution, stating his having captured a French Lugger Privateer, of 10 Guns (only 4 of which were mounted) and 34 Men, named the Revenge.

S I R,

I Beg Leave to acquaint you, that, on the 19th Instant, Offend bearing S. S. E. about Six or Seven Leagues, I observed His Majesty's Ships Ariadne and Plover in chace of a Lugger, in the N. W. Quarter, with Signals flying of the Chace being an Enemy; upon which I made all possible Sail

Sail after her I could, and in about Two Hours came up with and captured her. She proved to be the Revenge French Lugger Privateer, carrying 10 Carriage Guns, Two and Three Pounders, but only 4 mounted (the rest being in the Hold) and manned with 34 Men, 1 of whom was wounded by Exchange of Shot during the Chace. She had been out Two Days from Dunkirk, but had made no Captures.
