Naples, April 18.

Vienna, April 20, Here is a report, as if the Malecontrust in Hungary had again poliefied themfelves of fome of the Bergh Tamns, and made great spoing the affairs of that Kingdom Ieffen every days and we have great reason to believe that the Tarks, notwithstanding all the affurances they have given this Courst of the contrary, do underhand countenance and affit them, which is, to be apprehended they would do publickly, and 'more confiderably' were they not engaged in aWar with the Molecovites. Prince William of Fur flemberg has not yet obtained his liberty, which cannot now be long denied him, for the Courier that carried the Emperors Ratifications to Nimeguen, is daily expected back with those of France. The Emperor and the Empress are gone to take the Air at Laxemburg. We are told that the Duke of Lorrain will be very fhortly here, being, as we have already told you, to command the Imperial Forces in Hungary.

* Dantzick, April 22. The Dyct at Grodno is brocken up, having hift reiolved to make a defensive Alliance with the Ezar of Moleovy, upon condition the Czar surnish the Poles with 30000 men, and 2 millions of Gilders yearly, so long as the War shall continue; befides which, the Crown of Poland will maintain 30000 men more, and the Dutchy of Linkuania to000, which are all to act against the Turks, under the command of the King of Poland. The Letters from Livopia affure us, that the Suedes are preparing for a second Expedition into Pruffia, and that, their Army will be commanded by Ceunt Coningsmarke, who was late Governor of Romeren for the King of Sueden.

Berlin, April 30.
