CAPTAIN Waller, of His Majesty's Ship Emerald, arrived here Yesterday with Dispatches from Admiral Lord St. Vincent to Evan Nepean, Esq; Secretary of the Admiralty, of which the following are Extracts.

SIR,

I Desire you will acquaint the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty that I detached Rear-Admiral Nelson, and the Squadron named in the Margin, * with Orders to make an Attempt upon the Town of Santa Cruz in the Island of Teneriffe, which, from a Variety of Intelligence, I conceived was vulnerable. On Saturday the 15th of July the Rear-Admiral parted Company, and on Tuesday the 18th the Leander having joined from Lisbon, I sent her after the Rear-Admiral, under Instructions left by him. The Emerald joined Yesterday, with the inclosed Dispatch and Reports from the Rear-Admiral; and although the Enterprize has not succeeded, His Majesty's Arms have acquired a very great Degree of Lustre: Nothing from my Pen can add to the Eloges the Rear-Admiral gives of the Gallantry of the Officers and Men employed under him. I have greatly to lament the heavy Loss the Country has sustained in the severe Wound of Rear-Admiral Nelson, and the Death of Captain Richard Bowen, Lieutenant Gibson, and the other brave Officers and Men who fell in this vigorous and persevering Assault.

The Moment the Rear-Admiral joins, it is my Intention to send the Seahorse to England with him, the Wound Captain Fremantle has received in his Arm also requiring Change of Climate; and I hope that both of them will live to render important Services to their King and Country.

SIR,

IN Obedience to your Orders to make a vigorous Attack on the Town of Santa Cruz in the Island of Teneriffe, I directed, from the Ships under my Command, One Thousand Men, including Marines, to be prepared for Landing, under the Direction of Captain Troubridge, of His Majesty's Ship Cullogen, and Captains Hood, Thompson, Fremantle, Bowen, Miller and Waller, who very handsomely volunteered their Services; and although I am under the painful Necessity of acquainting you that we have not been able to succeed in our Attack, yet it is my Duty to state, that I believe more daring Intrepidity never was shewn than by the Captains, Officers and Men you did me the Honour to place under my Command.

Inclosed I transmit to you a List of Killed and Wounded; and amongst the former it is with the deepest Sorrow I have to place the Name of Captain Richard Bowen, of His Majesty's Ship Terpsichore, than whom a more enterprizing, able and gallant Officer does not grace His Majesty's Naval Service; and with great Regret I have to mention the Loss of Lieutenant John Gibson, Commander of the Fox Cutter, and a great Number of gallant Officers and Men.

Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Kingmill, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels on the Coast of Ireland, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated on Board L'Engageante, at Cork, the 24th of August, 1797.

S I R,

I Herewith transmit, for the Information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a Letter to me from Captain Pulling, of His Majesty's Sloop Penguin, containing Particulars relative to a capital Brig Privateer, and a Prize she had made of the Brig Express, of Dartmouth, bound to Newfoundland, both of which he has brought in herè.

S I R,

I Have the Honor to inform you, that on the 21st Instant, in Latitude 48 deg. 30 min. North, Longitude 8 deg. West, being on the Larboard Tack, with the Wind Easterly, blowing hard, at Half past Eight A. M. saw Two Sail a-head standing towards us, with every Appearance of being Cruizers. At Half past Nine, having weathered us about a Mile, they bore down, the headmost under English Colours, but very soon discovered themselves to be the Enemy, when we opened our Fire, which obliged them to haul up again on the Starboard Tack: I wore immediately, keeping under their Lee, with a constant Fire at both. At Three Quarters past Nine the sternmost struck, and hove-to, but the Sea running too high to take immediate Possession of her, and finding the other of much more Consequence,

who was making every Endeavour to escape, I continued the Pursuit, when, after an Hour and Forty Minutes running Fire, having shot away her Main-Topmast, she struck, and at Nine took Possession of her. Found her to be L'Oiseau French Privateer, of 18 Guns, (pierced for 20) 16 Nine-Pounders and 2 long French Twelves, with 119 Men on Board. At Half past Meridian wore, and made Sail after the other, who by this Time was nearly out of Sight, endeavouring to get off. At Four brought her to, and took Possession, finding her to be the Express, of Dartmouth, Prize to L'Oiseau, formerly L'Appocate French Privateer, of 12 Guns, taken a few Months ago.

L'Oiseau is quite new built, for a Corvette, launched in June last, and coppered: Her Length of Keel Seventy-three Feet, of Gun-Deck Eighty-seven Feet, and Breadth of Beam Twenty-five Feet: Her first Cruize from Nantz, out Thirty-four Days, and had taken Two other Vessels. She had been chased Five Times before by His Majesty's Frigates, but always maintained a decided Superiority of Sailing, spares the Penguin at least One-third of her Canvas; and we are much indebted to their Disorder, and a high Sea, for our Success. She had One Man killed, and Five wounded.

I beg Leave to express the warmest Approbation of the Conduct of my First Lieutenant, Mr. George Neat Tremlett, with every Officer and Man in His Majesty's Sloop I have the Honor to command, for their Zeal and steady Exertion during the Chace, working the Guns Knee high in Water for upwards of an Hour and an Half, carrying a great Press of Sail, with a heavy Sea, making fair Breaches constantly over us.

Extract of a Letter from Captain Payne, Commander of His Majesty's Ship Impetueux, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated in Cawsand Bay, the 28th of August, 1797.

ON the 23d of last Month we chased a Logger and Brig, both of which we captured; the latter being an American Vessel, Prize to the former, (which was called Petite Cherie) a French Privateer of Four Guns and Small Arms, and Twenty-two Men. The Privateer was manned and sent in Shore by Captain Stopford, and seized Three Polacres in Muros Bay, which were destroyed.
