At the General Session of the Peace of our Lord the King, holden for the City of London, (by Adjournment) at the Guildhall within the said City, on Monday the Eighteenth Day of September, in the Thirty-seventh Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, King of Great Britain, &c. before Brook Watson, Esq; Mayor of the City of London, Richard Clark, Esq; John Boydell, Esq; Sir William Herne, Knight, and others their Fellows, Justices of our said Lord the King, assigned to keep the Peace of our said Lord the King within the said City, and also to hear and determine divers Felonies, Trespases and other Misdemeanors committed within the said City;
