

St. James's, September 27, 1797.

*Ceremonial of the Knighthood and Investiture of Rear-Admiral Sir Horatio Nelson, Knight of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath.*

THE Knights Companions and Officers of the Order attended in the Privy Chamber, in the Mantles, Collars, &c. and proceeded from thence into the Sovereign's Presence; making the usual Reverences, in the following Order.

Deputy Bath King of Arms, Francis Townsend; Esq; The Genealogist of the Order, George Naylor, Esq; Windsor Herald, in the Mantle, Chain and Badge, York Herald, in his Mantle, Chain and Badge, and in his Hand the Sceptre of Bath, carrying the Ribbon and Badge of the Order on a Crimson Velvet Cushion.

Knights Companions.

Sir William Fawcett,

Lord Malmesbury,

His Royal Highness the Duke of York.

Then, by the Sovereign's Command, Rear-Admiral Horatio Nelson was introduced into the Presence between Sir William Fawcett and Lord Malmesbury, the two junior Knights Companions present, preceded by the Genealogist of the Order, acting for the Gentleman Usher, with Reverences as before.

The Sword of State was delivered to the Sovereign by Lord Malmesbury, the second Knight in Seniority, and Admiral Nelson, kneeling, was knighted therewith. Then His Royal Highness the Duke of York, the senior Knight, presented the Ribbon and Badge to the Sovereign, and His Majesty put them over the new Knight's Right Shoulder, who, being thus invested, had the Honor to kiss His Majesty's Hand; and the Procession returned to the Privy Chamber in the Order above mentioned.

The Ceremony was performed in His Majesty's Closet; several Great Officers of the Court being present.

In which intended Act it is proposed to make Provision for widening the Strand, on the South Side thereof, between Temple Bar and Arundel-Street; for widening Fleet-Street, on the North Side thereof, between Temple-Bar and Chancery-Lane; for widening Chancery-Lane and the East End of Carey-Street; and for making a new Street or Communication between the Strand and the South Side of Carey-Street, opposite Serle-Street, and from the North-East Corner of Lincoln's Inn Fields into Holborn.

Tynemouth-Haven, and River Tyne, from the ancient Limits of the said Port or Haven in the German Ocean, to its ancient Limits Westward; at or near Hedwin or Heddon Streams, in the County of Northumberland: Which said Port, Haven and River lie within, or are reputed to lie within, the County of the Town of Newcastle upon Tyne, or in, to or through, near, or adjoining the several Parishes, Chapelries and Townships herein after mentioned, namely, the Townships of Tynemouth, North Shields, and Chirton, in the Parish of Tynemouth; the Townships of Howdon Pans, Willington and Wall's-End, in the Parish of Wall's-End; the Townships of Little-Benton and Walker, in the Parish of Long-Benton; the Township of Byker, in the Parish or Parochial Chapelry of All-Saints, the said Chapelry of All-Saints, in Newcastle; the Parish of St. Nicholas, in Newcastle; the Townships of Westgate, Elswick and Benwell, in the Parish or Parochial Chapelry of St. John; the Townships of East-Denton, West-Denton, Sugley, Newburn-Hall, and Newburn, in the Parish of Newburn; the Township of Heddon-on-the-Wall, in the Parish of Heddon-on-the-Wall; the Townships of Westoe, South Shields, Monkton and Jarrow, High and Low Heworth, in the Parish of Jarrow, and the Chapelries of Hilda South Shields, and of Heworth, in the said Parish of Jarrow; the Parish of Gateshead; the Townships of Whickham, Whickham Low Hand and Swallowwell, in the Parish of Whickham; the Townships of Winlaton, Stella and Ryton, in the Parish of Ryton: Which said several Townships, in the said Parishes of Tynemouth, Wall's-End, Long Benton, All-Saints, St. John, Newburn, Heddon-on-the-Wall, Jarrow, Gateshead, Whickham and Ryton, and also the said Parish of St. Nicholas, and said Chapelries of St. Hilda South Shields, Heworth, and All Saints in Newcastle, lie within the Counties of Northumberland and Durham; and the said County of the Town of Newcastle upon Tyne.
