THE Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury, having appointed Money for the Payment of Half-Pay to Sea-Officers from the 1st of January to the 30th of June, 1797, according to His Majesty's Establishment on that Behalf: These are to give Notice, that the several Payments will begin to be made at the Pay-Office, by the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, at Ten o'Clock in the Morning, on the following Days, viz.

On Monday the 23d Instant, to Admirals, Captains, and their Attornies.

On Tuesday the 24th and Wednesday the 25th Instant, to Lieutenants and their Attornies:

And on Thursday the 26th Instant, to Masters and Surgeons.

After which the List will be recalled the First and Third Wednesdays in every Month, that all Persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable to them; and not only bring with them the Affidavit required, touching their not having enjoyed the Benefit of any Public Employment, either at Sea or on Shore, during the Time they are to be paid their Half-Pay, but also to produce Certificates that they have subscribed to the Test, and taken the Oaths of Allegiance, require.
