S I R,

THIS Afternoon arrived here La Decouverte French National Brig, of 14 Guns and 91 Men, Prize to His Majesty's Ship Unité, out Three Days from Nantz, supposed to be bound to Guadeloupe with secret Dispatches, which they threw overboard in Chace, and 10 of her Guns.

I Have the Honor to inform you, that, after a Chace of Five Hours, we have this Day captured the Telemachus, French Lugger Privateer, mounting 6 Brafs Six-Pounders on Carriages and 6 Swivels; she had on Board 35 Men. I cannot learn that she has taken any Thing, except a Danish Brig. I have put some Men on Board the Telemachus, and sent her to Plymouth.
