The KING's Most Excellent Majetty in Council. WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament paffed W in the Twenty-fixth Year of His late Ma-jelty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to oblige Ships "more effectually to perform their Quarantine, " and for the better preventing the Plague being " and for the better preventing the riague being " brought from Foreign Parts into Great Britain " or Ireland, or the Isles of Guernsey, Jursey, " Alderney, Sark or Man," it is, among many other Things, enacted, That all Ships and Vef-fels arriving, and all Persons, Goods and Merchandizes whatfoever, coming or imported into any Port or Place within Great Britain, or any of the Isles beforementioned, from any Place from whence His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeflors, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, shall judgeit probable that the Infection may be brought, shall be obliged to make their Quarantine in fuch Place and Places, for fuch Time, and in fuch Manner, as has been or shall, from Time to Time, be directed by His Majefly, His Heirs or Succe-fors, by His or Their Order or Orders, made in His or Their Privy Council, and notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette; and that until fuch Ships, Vessels, Persons, Goods and Merchandizes shall have respectively performed and be discharged from such Quarantine, no fuch Perfons, Goods or Merchandizes, or any of them, shall come or be brought on Shore, or go or be put on board any other Ship or Veffel, in any Place within His Majesty's Dominions, unless in such Manner, and in such Cases, and by fuch Licence, as shall be directed or permitted by fuch Order or Orders made by His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, in Council as aforefaid; and that all fuch Ships and Veffels, and the Perfons or

A^T the Court at St. James's, the 18th of October, Goods coming or imported in, or going or being put on board the fame, and all Ships, Veffels, Boats and Perfons receiving any Goods or Perfons out of the fame, shall be subject to such Orders, Rules and Dircctions concerning Quarantine, and the Prevention of Infection, as have been or fhall be made by His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, in Council, and notified by Proclamation or published in the London Gazette as aforementioned under such Pains and Penalties as are inflicted by the faid Act.

> And whereas Information has been received that a malignant and infectious Difease of the Nature of the Plague, exilts in the City of Philadelphia, in the State of Penfylvania, within the United States of America; His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, judging it probable that the faid Infection may be brought into this Kingdom from Philadelphia, doth thereupon deem it expedient, for the Safety of the Publick Health, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That all Ships, Veffels, Perfons, Goods and Merchandizes now arrived, of that fhall hereafter arrive in any Port of this Kingdom, or the Ifles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, from Philadelphia, or any Port within the State of Penfylvania, do make their Quarantine for Fourteen Days, which is to commence and be computed from the Day each Ship or Vessel shall come to Anchor in the Place appointed for the Performance of Quarantine, and not before.

> That the Places herein after named shall be and are hereby appointed to be the Places wherein fuch Ships or Vessels (not having the Infection on board) shall respectively perform Quarantine; that is to fay: All Ships or Vessels which are or shall be bound to the Port of London, or any Member. Creek, or other Parts thereof, or to the River Thames or Medway, shall perform their Quaran-tine in Standgate Creek ; all Ships or Vessels which

Gloucefter, Briftol, Bridgwater, or any of them, or any Member or Creek of them, or any of them, or to Padflow or St. Ive's, being Members of the Port of Plymouth, cr to Ilfracombe or Barnstaple, being Members of the Port of Exeter, or to any other Place within the faid Ports of Milfo d, Cardiff, Gloucester, Bristol or Bridgwater, or within the faid Members or Creeks, shall perform their Quarantine in Kingroad and Porshute Pill; all Ships and Vessels which are or thall be bound to the Port of Plymouth, except fuch Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, or to the Port of Exeter. except fuch Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, or to the Port of Pool, or any of the Members or Creeks or other Places within the faid Ports of Plymouth, Exeter and Pool, except as herein before excepted, or to Falmouth. a Member of the Port of Plymouth, or any Creek thereof, or any other Place therein, shall perform their Quarantine in a Place called St. Ive's Pool, within the Mouth of the Harbour of Falmouth ; all Ships or Veffels which are or fhall be bound to the Ports of Southampton, Chichester, Sandwich, or any of them, or any of the Members or Creeks thereof, or of any of them, or any other Place within the fame, shall perform their Quarantine at a Place called the Mother-Bank, near Portfmouth; all Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the Eastern Coast of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Leith, Borrowstonefs, Alloa, Dunbar, Kirkaldy, Anstruther, Preston-Pans, Dundee, Perth, Montrofe and Aberdeen, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine in Inverkeithing Bay; all Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the Weffern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Port Glafgow, Greenock, Irvine, Campbeltoun, Oban, Rothfay, Fort William, Air, Port Patrick, Stranraer and Wigtoun, or to any Member, Creck or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine at Lamlash in the Island of Ar-ran; all Ships or Vessels which are or shall be bound to the Northern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Inverness, Zetland, Orkney, Caithnels and Stornaway, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine in Cromarty Bay in the Murray Firth; all Ships or Veffels which are or fhall be bound to the South-Weft Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Dumfries and Kirkcudbright, or to any Member, Creek or other Parts thereof, fhall perform their Quarantine at Carff-horn, at the Wouth of the River Nith; all Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the lile of Jerley, or any Part thereof, shall perform their

Quarantine at a certain Place on the Coaft of the faud Ifland, called Belle-Croute, or at fome Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coaft of England; and all Ships or Veffels which are or fhall be bound to the Iflands of Guernfey, Sark or Alderney, or either of them, or any Part of them, or any of them, fhall perform their Quarantine in a Place near the Ifland of Guernfey, called the Little Road, or at fome Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coaft of England.

That no Pilot shall go on board any Ship or Vessel obliged to perform Quarantine, in order to conduct the fame into any Port or Place, but shall perform such Service in some other Boat or Vessel, which Boat or Vessel shall keep as much to the Windward of the Ship or Vessel fo to be conducted as possible; and if any Pilot or other Perfon shall go on board such Ship or Vessel, such Pilot or other Perfon shall perform Quarantine, in like Manner as any Perfon coming in such Ship or Vessel shall be obliged to perform the fame.

That all Goods, Wares and Merchandizes liable to Quarantine as aforefaid, shall be opened, unpacked and aired, unless His Majefty shall think fit, by His Order in Council, to direct otherwife, and fo remain a Week, other than Hemp and Flax, Paper or Books, Silk, raw, thrown or wrought, Linen, Cotton-Wool, Cotton-Yarn or manufac-tured, Wool raw or any wife wrought, Feathers, Grogram or Mohair Yarn, Human Hair, Goats Hair, Carmenia Wool, Carpets, Camblets, Burdets, or other Manufactures of Silk and Cotton, Kid-Skins, and Skins in the Wool or Hair, Sponges, Wine and Oil in Cheits, Thread Stockings, all Goods packed with Straw or Cotton, Straw Hats and Bruthes, Matting, and Artificial Flowers; which Goods and Merchandizes, fo as aforefaid enumerated, are to be opened, unpacked and aired, unless His Majesty shall think fit, by His Order in Council, to direct otherwife, and fo remain for the Space of a Fortnight.

That fuch Perfons as, after Quarantine performed, fhall be employed in the Hold of any Ship or Vefil, for the taking any Goods not liable to retain infection, from the Goods and Merchandizes before enumerated, fhall be obliged to perform a new Quarantine. That the Captains of every His Majefty' Ships of War, who shall meet any fuch Ship o Vessel coming to any of the Ports of Great Britain, or of the Isles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, shall take due Care to prevent the landing any Goods, Seamen or Passengers from on Board the fame, until they shall be put under the Direction of the Officers of His Majesty's Custers.

That the Commissioners and other Officers of His Majeity's Customs do use their utmost Diligence and Care that the Quarantine before directed be duly performed.

That the Commanders of His Majefly's Ships of War, as likewife the Commanders of His Majefly's Forts and Garrifons lying near the Sea Coafts, and all Juftices of the Peace, Mayors, Sheriffs, Bailiffs, Chief Magittrates, Conftables, Headboroughs, Tythingmen, and all other Officers and Minifters of Juffice, be aiding and affifting to the faid Officers of His Majefly's Cuftoms, and to all others that fhall be concerned in ftopping all fuch Ships as aforefaid, and in bringing them to the Places appointed for the Performance of their Quarantine, and in due Performance thereof.

And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid respective Isles of Jersey, Guernfey, Alderney.
