The KING's Most Excellent Majetty in Council. WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament paffed W in the Twenty-fixth Year of His late Ma-jelty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to oblige Ships "more effectually to perform their Quarantine, " and for the better preventing the Plague being " and for the better preventing the riague being " brought from Foreign Parts into Great Britain " or Ireland, or the Isles of Guernsey, Jursey, " Alderney, Sark or Man," it is, among many other Things, enacted, That all Ships and Vef-fels arriving, and all Persons, Goods and Merchandizes whatfoever, coming or imported into any Port or Place within Great Britain, or any of the Isles beforementioned, from any Place from whence His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeflors, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, shall judgeit probable that the Infection may be brought, shall be obliged to make their Quarantine in fuch Place and Places, for fuch Time, and in fuch Manner, as has been or shall, from Time to Time, be directed by His Majefly, His Heirs or Succe-fors, by His or Their Order or Orders, made in His or Their Privy Council, and notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette; and that until fuch Ships, Vessels, Persons, Goods and Merchandizes shall have respectively performed and be discharged from such Quarantine, no fuch Perfons, Goods or Merchandizes, or any of them, shall come or be brought on Shore, or go or be put on board any other Ship or Vessel, in any Place within His Majesty's Dominions, unless in such Manner, and in such Cases, and by fuch Licence, as shall be directed or permitted by fuch Order or Orders made by His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, in Council as aforefaid; and that all fuch Ships and Veffels, and the Perfons or

A<sup>T</sup> the Court at St. James's, the 18th of October, Goods coming or imported in, or going or being put on board the fame, and all Ships, Veffels, Boats and Perfons receiving any Goods or Perfons out of the fame, fhall be fubject to fuch Orders, Rules and Dircctions concerning Quarantine, and the Prevention of Infection, as have been or thall be made by His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, in Council, and notified by Proclamation or published in the London Gazette as aforementioned under such Pains and Penalties as are inflicted by the faid Act.

> And whereas Information has been received that a malignant and infectious Difease of the Nature of the Plague, exilts in the City of Philadelphia, in the State of Penfylvania, within the United States of America; His Majefty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, judging it probable that the faid Infection may be brought into this Kingdom from Philadelphia, doth thereupon deem it expedient, for the Safety of the Publick Health, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That all Ships, Veffels, Perfons, Goods and Merchandizes now arrived, of that fhall hereafter arrive in any Port of this Kingdom, or the Ifles of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man, from Philadelphia, or any Port within the State of Penfylvania, do make their Quarantine for Fourteen Days, which is to commence and be computed from the Day each Ship or Vessel shall come to Anchor in the Place appointed for the Performance of Quarantine, and not before.

> That the Places herein after named shall be and are hereby appointed to be the Places wherein fuch Ships or Vessels (not having the Infection on board) shall respectively perform Quarantine; that is to fay: All Ships or Vessels which are or shall be bound to the Port of London, or any Member. Creek, or other Parts thereof, or to the River Thames or Medway, shall perform their Quaran-tine in Standgate Creek ; all Ships or Vessels which
