AHorrid Murrber baving beex yefferday committed upon James late Lord Arcbbijhop of St. Andrews, Primate and Mctropolitan of the - (ingdom, the folloving Proclamation batb been ordered by Hie Majeflies Prizy Councilito be Publijbed, for the Apprebending the Afalifinates.


H $A$ RLES by the Grace of God, King of Great Brimitr, France and Irelart, Defender of the Fairh, ©tc. To Our Lyon King at Arms, and his Brethren Heraulde, Macers, or Meffengers ac Arme, Our Sheriffs in that part, conjunaly and feverally ipecially conftitute, Greeting: We being fully and by legal Proofs affured of the late Horrid and Bloody Murther commitced upon Satutday laf, being the 34 day of May inftant, by Ten or Fleven Fanatick and Execrable Affafinates, upon the Perfon of the molt Reverend Fathes in, God, James, late Archbifhop of St, Andecres Permate of all Scotlard ; which Barbarous'and Inhumane Affaffimation will ( whe dolbt not) fpread Horror and Amarement in the Hearts of fucb as believe chac there is a God, or a Chriftian Yeligion; ACrueley exceeding the Barbariry ofalagans and Heatheos, amongit whom the Officers and Minifters of Religionate repared to besacred, and are by tbe refpect born to a Deity Whom they Adore, fecured anaint all fuch Bloody and Exe: crable Attempts; A Cruclty exceeding the belief of all crue Proteftants, whofs Churches have jufly Stigmatized with the Marks of Impiety, all fuch as defile with Blood shofe Hands which they nugbeto hold op to Heaven;and a Cruelty equal ta any with which we can reproach the Enemies of this True and Reformed Ctureb! By which allo not only the Principles of Humane Sociery, but Our Authority and Government (the Archbithop of St. And ems being one of Our Privy Council) ia bighly violated, and Example and Incouragement given for Murchering aH fuch as ferve US faithfully, according sothe Prefcript of Our Laws and Royal Commands: Daily Intiances whereof we are to expea, whilft Field. Conventicles, thofe Rendezrnufes of Rebellion, and Forgers of all Blondy and Jefuitical Principles, are fo fiequeged and follonved, to the Scardal of all Government, and the Contempt of Ottr Laws; and which Murcher is as fat as is pofiblercenderedyte, nore, deteftable, by the unmasked Doldne is of fuch as durif opeply with bare Faces in the midet of Our Kingdom, at Mid day afemble themfelves togeoher, to Kill in Our Highwaythe Primate of Qar Kingiom, and one of Oor Privy Codncil, by fo many Strokes and Shors, as left his Body as it were, thut brie Wound, and many of whict being given after thet knew he was Dead, were remarkabie Proofs they were aded by firie of Hellifit and Infatiable Crueley :

Have eherefore, with Advice of Our Privy Cnuncil, \&houghow. fir herehy to Command and Charge all Sheriffs, Ste wavdsiBayf liffs of Regaluties and Bayliaries, and their Depuries, Magifirates of Burghs, and Officers of Our Standing Forces, eo Search, Seck, Take, and Apprehend the Perfons Guity of the faid Horrid Murther, or any Sulpetted by them, until they be broughe to Juftice; and ali nur good and faithful Subjtat to concur in the Taking and Securing $f$ as far as is in theis pop-er) thafe Aff.ginates. And in refpea there is a Compqny of vigrant apd skulking Ruffians, who, to the great Contempetof. all Governnent, do Ride through this Our Kingtom, Killing Qur Soldicts, Deforcing fuch as put Our Laus in Hxecurinnx and Committing fuch Horrible Murthers, who paighr be eafily Difcovered., if all fucb, amongit whom they Converfe, didf according to their Duty, endeavor, to Appsenend them, or aive Natice of their Refidence. We pave therefore thounhy fir,
 Command and Charge all Our Subjetas, that whenever any tunknown Men or Vagabo:zds happen to repair amngett them, That they with all poffible fpeed Certifie any of Our Privy

Colrncil, Offieers of Our Forces, or any having Truft undet Us thereol; With Cecenfication to them; That if they omat che fame, they thall be punithed with all Rigur, Copform ro the faid AG. And fince ficveral of the faid Aff finates are known to bave been Tenants in the shire of Eff, whofe faces will be known to fach of the Witneffis as were prifenc. We hequby Hequire and Command all the Hercters and Maliers of ahefaid Shire of Fiffe and Kiproff, to bring theit Tenants: Cottars and Servants, living in she refpedive Presbyteries, openn the feveral days, and to the plices following, vit. to St? Andeeps, \&rc. There to be feen by the faid Wieniffes and ed continue there unsil they be Exanolned ${ }_{3}$ Witb Certification to futh of che Iaid Tenant, Cottars and.Servants as fhall be abficer, they flall be reputed as acceffo 5 to the faid Crime 3 And the Maftefi, if they produce them not, or if hereafter they harbof any thar thall not Compefín o they thall be reputed as Favorer: of the faid Afficinatiofic And whereas there are fiveral Perfons undes Caption and Incercommuning in. the faid Shire for feveral Caules, and left Perfons, who are innocent, may be chereby debarred from appearing, We have thoughe fit hereby to filt and fuperfede alftaccution upon any Letcers of Caption de Intercommuning, or any other Wartant, fur fecum ring of Perfons for the fpace of Forty eighe hours, after the Gid Diexs of appearance. And to the end the faid cruel Murthea may be tine more caflly difcover'd, We do hereby offer and give fuli affurance of our tidempnity to any one of the faid Affafd finates, who lliall difcover bis Comptiers,and fuch as hounded them our, and prefent payment of the Sam of Ten thoufand Merks, ce any who hall inform who were the faid Afflisatesy if upon his Information they, of any of them can be Apprehended, that tbey may be brooght to condign Punith ienc* And we Ord ain thefe Prefents to be Priated and Publifhed at Whe 3arker-Crofi of Edinburgh, and other Places nendful.

From strasburg they write, that feveral of the Imperiad Troops that had been in Garifon there, were marched from thence, and that the relf were to follow; bitt that at the fame time the Erench were drawing their froops togethery and would in few days have an Army of a coao jmen; that on the ather fide the Duke of LorFain was likewife taking the Field with the Imperial Forces, and would continue in it till the leace was executeत.
