Horrid Murther having been yesterday committed A upon James late Lord Arcbbishop of St. An-arews, Primate and Metropolitan of the Kingdom, the following Proclamation bath been ordered by His Majeflies Privy Council to be Fublished, for the Apprebending the Affaffinates.

HARLES by the Grace of God, King of Great Britain, France and Ireland, Defender of the Faith, &C. To Our Lyon King at Arms, and his Brethren Heraulda, Macers, or Meffengers at Arms, Our Sheriffs in that part, conjuncily and feverally ipecially conflitute, Greeting: We be-ing fully and by legal Proofs affured of the late Horrid and Bloody Murther committed upon Saturday 1aß, being the 3d day of May inftant, by Ten or Fleven Fanatick and Executed Alfafinates, upon the Perform of the molt Reverend Father in God, James, late Archbifhop of St. Andrews Primate of all Sconland 3 which Barbarous and Inhumane Affaffination will (we doubt not) Spread Horror and Amazement in the Hearts of fuch as believe that there is a Godyor a Chriftian Religion; (we doubt not) spread Horror and Amazement in the Hearts of fuch as believe that there is a Ood,or a Chriftian Religion; Actuelty exceeding the Barbariry of. Pagans and Heathens, amongft whom the Officers and Ministers of Religion are re-patted to be Sacred, and are by the respect born to a Deity whom they Adore, fecured against all such Bloody and Exc-erable Attempts; A Crucky exceeding the belief of all true Protestants, whole Churches have justly Stigmatized with the Marks of Impicty, all such as defile with Blood those Hands which they ougher to hold on to Heaves and a Crucky coult to Marks of İmpicty, all luch as defile with Biood thofe Hands which they ougher to hold op to Heaven; and a Cruelty equal to any with which we can reproach the Enemies of this True and Reformed Church ! By which allo not only the Principles of Humane Society, but Our Authority and Government (the Archbifhop of St. And. ew; being one of Our Privy Conneil) in highly violated, and Example and Incouragement given for Murthering all fuch as ferve Us faithfully, according to the Prefeript of Our Laws and Royal Commands : Daily Inflan-ces whereof we are to expect, whilf Field. Convenicles, thofe Rendezvoufes of Rebellion, and Forgers of all Blondy and Jefuritical Principles, are fo frequented and followed, to the Scandal of all Government, and the Contempt of Our Laws; and which Murther is as far as is pofible rendered yet, more. and which Murcher is as far as is poffible rendered yet, more, deteftable, by the unmasked Boldneis of fuch as durft openly with bare Faces in the middle of Our Kingdom, at Mid day affemble themfelves together, to Kill in Our Highwaythe Primate of Our Kingdom, and one of Our Privy Copheil, by for many Strokes and Shors, as left his Body as it were, but bre Wound, and many of which being given after they knew for was Dead, were remarkable Proofs they were afted by a fpirity of Middle and Many of which being given after they knew for

We have therefore though fit, Conform to the 144 A& of Parliament 12, King June & to Command and Charge all Our Subje&s, that whenever any unknown Men or Vagabords happen to repair among them, That they with all possible speed Certific any of Our Privy

Officers of Our Forces, or any having Truft under Composition, Otherstor Our Porces, or any naving True under Us thereof; With Cettification to them, That if they omit the fame, they shall be punished with all Rigor, Conform to the faid AC. And fince feveral of the faid Aff strates are known to have been Tenants in the Shire of F ff, whole Paces will be known to fach of the Wineffer as were prefent. We have though fit hereby to fift and fuperfede all + accution upon any Letters of Caption de Intercommuning, or any other Warrant, for fecun-ring of Perfons for the fpace of Forty eight hours, after the faid Diets of appearance. And to the end the faid cruei Murther may be the more callly difeover'd, We do hereby offer and give full affurance of our indempnity to any one of the faid Affall finates, who fluall difeover his Gampliaes, and fuch as hounded them out, and prefent payment of the Sam of Ten thousand Merks, to any who fhall inform who were the faid Affaffinates, if upon his Information they, or any of them can be Appre-hended, that they may be brought to condign Punish ene And We Ordsis their Prefents to be Printed and Published at the Market-Crofs of Edinkargh, and other Places needful.

Dantzick, May 6. The Letters we receive from Poland, give us an account, that the King was parted from Grodno for Warfaw, where a great Council of War isto be held the 10 or 11 of the next Month, for the taking such resolutions as are fit, coi-cerning the conduct of Affairs with relation to the War against the Turks, which the Crown of Poland is now going to enter into, in purluance of the Alliance with the Czar of Moscovy, which Prince Radgevilt, who is going in quality of Ambal-lador Extraordinaty to Moleo, is to conclude. Wo are told that the King of Poland is fending Commiffioners hither, who are to Examine the matter of the Infult committed many months fince, by the Rabble of this Town, upon the Carmelite Friars, and to fee Justice done upon the Offenders, which it's seared may renew those diforders, which feem at prefent pretty well composed. From Riga in Livo+ ma they write, that they are not only making new levies in that Country, but that they likewife exp. cl feveral Troops from Sueden, to reinforce the Army! with which the Suedes intend to fall a fecond time into Pruffial for at least to march that way, to obtige the Elector of Brandenburg to fend part of his Porces thither, and confequently to divert him from giving any allifance to the King of Denmark. as it is reported he promiled when he was at .Conningsberg, the Minister that was there from that King, he would do,

Mintegaten, May + 5: The Sicur Meinders, the Brandenburgh Minilter, (of whole arrival here you had an account in our laft) hath fince had feveral Conferences, with Monfieur Colbert the French Ani-ballador, but not being able to agree with him the terms of the Peacel nor totobrain a Prolongation of the Cellation of Arms beyond the 20th inftant, he is preparing to pais on to Paris, to fee if he can be more fuccesful there,

Bruffels, May 160 The Bilhop of Straburgh is faily expected here in his way for Germany, whicher he will in all probability the more haften, becaufe of the indispolition of the Elector of Calogne, whole Coadjutor he pretends to be. Yelterday Bon Emahuel de Lyra, the Spanish Envoy, returned to the Hague, where he will repeat his infrances to the States to have Maestricht delivered to the King of Spain, and with the greater hopes of fusceeding in them, because die States have conferred to the reflabilihment of the Jeluites at Maestricht, which it's thought they would not have done, if they had intended to keep that place in their own hands. From Strasburg they write, that feveral of the Imperial Troops that had been in Garifon there, were marched from thence, and that the reft were to follow; but that at the fame time the French were drawing their Troops together; and would in few days have an Army of Baoao men ; that on the other fide the Duke of Lor-Fain was likewife taking the Field with the Imperial Forces, and would continue in it till the Peace was executed.

Hague, May 161 .The Frince of Orange parted From hence on Friday laft for Breda, from whence he will return again fome time the next week-The Sicur uan Leeuwen, Ambalfador Extraordinary from this State to His Majelty of Great Britain, is preparing for his Journey for England, which he will now begin in few days. The Gonferences between the suedes Ambaffador, and the Deputies of the States, have not yet had any effect, the points in difference of the Freaty of Commerce, remaining in the fame Hate they were in, when his Excellency same hither from Mineguen: however the faid Conferences are continued, and may at length produces an adjuliment of them. This day we discovered of this place the Greenwich and Dartmouth Frigates with feveral Merchant ships from the Canaries bound for the Downes.
