Stag, at Sea, October 5, 1797.

S I R,

I Have the Honor to acquaint you, that, on the 30th of September, His Majesty's Ship Stag fell in with and destroyed Le Cocyte, French Lugger Privateer, of 4 Guns and 30 Men, off Plymouth, out Ten Days from Morlaix, without taking any Thing.

Copy of a Letter from Captain James O'Bryen, Commander of His Majesty's Sloop Childers, to Ewan Nepean, Esq; dated Plymouth, October 28, 1797.

S I R,

I HAVE the Honor to acquaint you with my Arrival here with Le Furet French Schooner Privateer, mounting 4 Four-Pounders, pierced for 14, carrying 50 Men, a remarkable swift Sailer; she was captured by the Triton, Childers in Company, on Tuesday the 24th, between the Isle of Bas and Alreverak, on her Return to Tregnier, after a Three Weeks Cruise, during which she had made but one Capture.

SCHOOL of PHYSIC in IRELAND.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in Ireland, in the Twenty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, in ituled, "An Act for establishing a complete School of Physic in this Kingdom," it is enacted, "That several Professorships shall be established." And whereas Doctor Stephen Dickson, Professor of the Practice of Physic under said Act, has communicated, in Writing, to the President and Fellows of the King and Queen's College of Physicians, his Wish to resign his said Professorship, and authorizing them to vacate it on a certain Day; and whereas the said President and Fellows of the King and Queen's College of Physicians have consented to accept Doctor Dickson's Resignation, and vacate his said Professorship: Notice is hereby given, that the Election of King's Professor of the Practice of Medicine in the City of Dublin, on the Foundation of Sir Patrick Dun, will be held at the House of the Provost of Trinity College, Dublin, on Tuesday the 6th Day of February, 1798, after such Examination as the Electors may require, which will begin at the Hour of Twelve o'Clock on said Day.

The following Emoluments and Advantages attend this Professorship.—The Professor will receive the yearly Sum of One Hundred Pounds, (to commence at the Time of his Election) and also may charge reasonable Fees to be paid by all such Persons as attend his Lectures: The said Fees to be paid on Admission, and to be from Time to Time regulated by the King and Queen's College of Physicians in Ireland.

The Lectures are to commence on the first Monday in November, and to continue until the End of April, and are to be given Four Days in the Week (at least) in Trinity College, Dublin. They are also to be delivered in the English Language, unless it be otherwise ordered by the President and Fellows of the said King and Queen's College of Physicians. This Professorship is open to Persons of all Nations, provided they have taken Medical Degrees, and will become vacant at the End of Seven Years from the Date of the Election; but at the Expiration of the said Seventh Year, the same Professor may be again elected. The Electors are bound to the strictest Impartiality, by an Oath required by the said Act to be taken by every Elector previous to the Election.

It is desired that all Persons intending to offer themselves as Candidates for said Professorship do, within Two Months from the Date hereof, send their Names, and also an Account of the Places of the Education, of the Universities in which they have taken their Medical Degrees, and of the Places in which they have practised, to the Reverend Gerald Fitzgerald, D.D. Trinity College, and to Mathew Stritch, Esq; M. D. Great Britain Street, Dublin, who will give any further Information on the Subject that may be necessary.
