Date the Twenty fixu Day of December, 47 yes promife and declare, thathe Bopnties of Five Pounds or ever'y Able Seama, and Two Pound's Ten Shitlings for every' Ordinary: Seaman, "fos: for His Majefy's Service, thouldy be' paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and: Ordinasy Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor.

Under the Age of Twenty Years, who tiould, on or before the :Twenty-eighth Day' of : February. then following, enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majelty's Ships:or Veffels, or Officers employed on Shore for raifing. Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas, His Majelty was allo gracioully pleafed, by his faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Tiwenty Years, who hheuld fo enter themfelves as aforefaid, fhould receive the Sum of Thirty Shllings each Many as His Majefty's Royal Boanty: And whereas His Majefty was affo gracioully pleafed, by His Royal. Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February, 179.3, to promife and declare; that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to Terve on board His Majefty's Ships, Mould be paid to any Perfon who ghould difeover any seaman or Seamen who might coneeal him or themifelves; fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen hould be taken for His Majefty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of Apilil then next, by any of His Majefty's Sea Officers appointed to raife Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majefty's Ships or. Vefle's in the Ports, or on the Coatts of this Fingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward, hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirty-firlt Day of this inftant October; and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Bounkies and Reward thould be continued to be paid for fome Time longet ; His Majetty with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore ortiers and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended, from the faid Thirty-firt Day of this inflant Oetober to the Thir ty-firf Day of Deceraber next inclufive :- Whereof all Perfons conceríed are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
