

Admiralty-Office, November 28, 1797. Copy of a Letter from Admiral Lord Duncan, Com-mander in Chief of His Majefty's Ships and Veffels in the North Sea, to Evan Nepean, E/q; dated the 25th Instant.

SIR,

I Herewith enclose, for the Information of the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, a Lift of the Killed and Wounded, on the 11th of October last, on Board fuch of His Majefty's Ships under my Command, whole Situations after the Action prevented their Returns being made, in Time to be included in the one before transmitted. I am, &c.

#### DUNCAN.

A Lift of Killed and Wounded on Board fuch of His Majesty's Ships under my Command, who were in the Action of the 11th of October last, and from whom no Return was made before.

Montagu.—3 Seamen killed; 2 Officers, 2 Seamen, 1 Marine, wounded.

Director .--- 6 Seamen, 1 Marine, wounded.

Monmouth.- 1 Officer, 1 Seaman, 2 Marines, 1 Boy, killed; 16 Seamen, 2 Marines, 4 Boys, wounded. Veteran.—1 Officer, 3 Seamen, killed; 21 Seamen

wounded.

## Whiteball, November 27, 1797.

The King has been pleafed to recommend to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of St: Paul, London, the Reverend Charles Mols, Doctor in Divinity, to be by them elected into the Place of Canon Relidentiary of the faid Cathedral Church, the fame being void by the Death of the Reverend Doctor Richard Farmer.

The King has also been pleased to grant to the Reverend John Wheler, Clerk, Bachelor of Laws, the Place and Dignity of a Canonry or Prebend of the Collegiate Church of St. Peter, Westminster, void by the Refignation of Doctor Charles Mofs.

The King has also been pleased to prefent the Reverend William Pearce, Doctor in Divinity, to the Deanry of Ely, void by the Death of Doctor William Cooke, late Dean thereof.

#### Whitehall, November 28, 1797.

The King has been pleafed to grant unto Richard Brooke Supple, of Great Oakley in the County of Northampton, and of Ahadoe, in the Barony of Imokilly in the County of Cork, Efq; Lieutenant-Colonel of the Northamptonshire Militia, His Royal Licence and Authority that he and his Iffue may take and use the Name of De Capell, (being the ancient Surname of his paternal Anceftors) inflead of that of Supple; and add thereto, in Compliance with the Will of his maternal Great Uncle, Wheeler Brooke, late of Great Oakley aforefaid, Efq; deceafed, the Surname of Brooke; and that he may henceforth write himfelf, and be called, Richard-Brooke
