*Copy of a Letter from Rear-Admiral Harvey, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels at the Leeward Islands, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated on Board the Prince of Wales, in Port Royal Bay, Martinique, the 5th of October, 1797.*

S I R,  
BE pleased to acquaint their Lordships, that His Majesty's Sloop Bittern, commanded by Lieutenant Edward Kittoe, fell in with, the 13th Ultimo, off Tortola, and captured, the French Ship Privateer l'Agréable, of 18 Guns, Nine and Six Pounders, and 115 Men, which had left Guadaloupe Two Days before, and taken nothing; had been just fitted out, is a fast Sailer, and coppered.

The Capture of this Vessel under her first Equipment is of much Consequence; and the very spirited Manner in which she was attacked and captured in the Night, (although without Resistance) does great Credit to the Conduct of Lieutenant Kittoe.

*Copy of another Letter from Rear-Admiral Harvey to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated the 5th of October, 1797.*

S I R,

I AM to acquaint you, for the Information of their Lordships, that His Majesty's Ship Lapwing, on the 1st of August, being to the Northward of Tortola, in Lat. 22 deg. 20 min. captured Le Regulus French Privateer Sloop, belonging to Porto Rico, of 4 Guns and 26 Men, which Captain Barton sent to St. Christopher; she had been out Fifteen Days, and had captured an American Brig.
