A PROCLAMATION,

For giving Currency to a New Coinage of Seven Shilling Gold Pieces.

GEORGE R.

THEREAS We have thought fit to order, that certain Pieces of Gold Money should be coined, which should be called "Seven Shilling Pieces," each of which should be of the Value of Seven Shillings, and Three of which should be of the Value of Seven Shillings, and Three of which should be of the Value of One Guinea; and that each Piece should be be of the Weight of I Pennyweight 19 Grains 1000 Third of the Weight of a Guinea; and that Three of such Pieces should be do the Weight of 5 Pennyweights 9 Grains 4000 Troy Weight, of Standard Gold; being the Weight of a Guinea, according to the Weights approved and confirmed by Us in Our Council, in pursuance of an Act made in the Fourteenth Year of Our Reign, initialed, "An Act for "regulating and ascertaining the Weights to be made Use of in weighing the Gold and Silver." Coin of this Kingdom." And We have further thought fit to order, that every such Piece of Gold Money, so ordered to be coined as aforefaid, should have, on one Side thereof, Our Effigies or Portraiture, with Our Name, and the Words Dei Gratia, and on the Reverse, the Regal Crown of England, with the following Legend, Mag. Bri. Fr. Et Hib. Rex. And whereas Pieces of Gold Money of the above Description have been coined at Our Tower of London, and will be coined there, in pursuance of Orders which we have given for that Purpose, We have therefore, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, thought fit to issue this Our Royal Proclamation; and We do hereby ordain, declare and

command, that the faid Pieces of Gold Money for coined and to be coined as aforefaid, shall be current and lawful Money of Our Kingdom of Great Britain, and shall be called Seven Shilling Pieces, and shall pass and be received as current and lawful Money of Our faid Kingdom; and every of such Pieces shall pass and be received as of the Value of Seven Shillings of Our lawful Money of Our faid Kingdom, and Three of such Pieces shall pass and be received as of the Value of One Guinea of Our lawful Money of Our faid Kingdom, in all Payments whatsoever.

Given at Our Court at St. James's the Twentyninth Day of November, One thousand seven hundred and nine-seven, in the Thirty-eighth Year of Our Reign.

Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Kingfmill, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Sups and Veffels on the Coast of Iveland, to Evan Nepean, Ejy; dated on Board the Penguin, at Cork, the 11th of December, 1797.

SIR,

Have the Satisfaction to enclose, for the Information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a Letter to me, from Captain Faulknor, of His Majesty's Ship Diana, giving an Account of his having captured a fast sailing French Corvette, La Mouche, of 18 Guns and 122 Men; sitted out from La Rochelle as a Privateer, with which the Diana arrived here Yesterday.

Diana, at Sea, December 8, 1797.

SIR,

Have the Pleasure of acquainting you, that on the 5th Instant, being in Lat. 50 deg. 17 min. Long. 21 deg. I fell in with, and captured, after a Chace of Four Hours, La Mouche, a National Corvette, fitted in every Respect for a Six Weeks Cruize by the Merchants at Rochelle; had been from that Place Fifteen Days, without making any English Captures; she fent in, Five Days prior to my falling in with her, an American, from the Isle of France, bound to Bourdeaux, which he detained on Suspicion, having no French Pass on Board.

La Mouche is a Ship of considerable Force, having Eleven Ports of a Side, but only 16 Twelve-Pounders on Board when I fell in with her; Six of which were thrown overboard during the Chace. The Captain of her informs me she had a thorough Repair and was new coppered in September last.

That the fails remarkably fast there is no Doubt of, as had it not been for her carrying away her Fore-Top-Mast during the Chace, the determined Way in which she continued on after that, notwithstanding the Diana's Shot going over her, gave me Reason to fear, from the Evening's coming on very thick and foggy, I might have lost her. She has run most of the War with great Success in annoying our Trade, which makes the Capture of a Ship of her Description add considerably to the Pleafure of.
