P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREEAS it has been represented to His Majesty at this Board, That the malignant and infectious Disease, of the Nature of the Plague, which some Time since manifested itself at Philadelphia in the State of Pennsylvania, within the United States of America, has totally ceased; His Majesty, taking the same into Consideration, and being desirous to remove all Restraints upon Trade, so far as may be consistent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That the Quarantine laid by His Majesty's Order in Council, bearing Date the 18th Day of October, 1797, upon all Ships, Vessels, Persons, Goods and Merchandize, arriving, or to arrive from Philadelphia, or any Port within the State of Pennsylvania, be taken off; and that all such Ships and Vessels be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings, without unpacking, opening and airing, and without performing any Quarantine, as freely as they might have done in case such Order of the 18th Day of October, 1797, had not been made; any Thing in the said Order contained to the contrary notwithstanding. — And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

THE following Addresses have been presented to the King; which Addresses His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Lieutenant-Governor, Council, and Deputies of the Isle of Man, in Tynwald assembled, most gratefully sensible of the many and inestimable Blessings we enjoy under the mild and just Reign of your Majesty; and ever animated with Principles of purest Loyalty and warmest Attachment to your Majesty's Royal Person, and to that Government and Nation under whose Protection it is, only, that we do or can hope to preserve the Continuance of those Blessings, think it, on this Occasion, our absolute Duty to approach your Majesty with the Expressions of these our Sentiments, and more especially at a Time when, in Return for the earnest Efforts of your Majesty to give Peace to your Kingdoms, on Terms honourable and safe, we see, with a just Indignation, that in the whole Conduct, as well as repeated Declarations of our inveterate and implacable Enemies, they have manifested the most steadfast Determination of excluding all Means of Peace, of pursuing at all Hazards their hostile Designs against the Honor, the Happiness and Safety of your Majesty's Kingdoms, and of not being satisfied with any Thing short of the absolute Destruction of every Thing we hold the most sacred, the most near and dear to us, as Freemen or as Men.

Under these Circumstances, the Necessity seems to us most obvious, of a cordial and entire Union of Hearts and Hands, throughout the Whole of your Majesty's Dominions, as the most effectual Means (and which we think could not fail) of saving us from all this Ruin meditated by our Enemies, and we consider of the highest Importance, that the manly and truly virtuous Determination unanimously taken by all your Majesty's Subjects should be declared to the World, that we are ready to suffer every Extremity rather than submit to the insolent Demands of our Enemies, or accept of any Terms of Peace, which, if not both safe and honourable, cannot, we must know, secure to us our Freedom and Independence, nor scarce indeed even suspend the Ruin of them.

It is with Great Britain the Isle of Man must, and will, stand or fall: Conscious, therefore, of this our most direct and highest Interest, we most faithfully beg Leave to assure your Majesty, that we are ready, we are willing, to the utmost Extent of our Power and Means, to stand forward, with the rest of our Fellow Subjects, in the Defence of your Majesty's sacred Person, in maintaining the Honour of your Crown, and in preserving, with the Territories, the Constitution of the British Empire.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Keys, the Constitutional Representatives of the People of the Isle of Man.

Connected as we are with Great Britain, though unimportant in ourselves, we beg Leave to approach your Majesty's Throne with Sentiments of the most sincere and cordial Attachment to your Royal Person and Government.

We cannot at the present momentous Crisis but lament, in common with the rest of your Majesty's Subjects, the unhappy Failure of the Endeavours to effect a safe and honourable Peace; and deploring as we do the Horrors necessarily attendant upon War, we trust and hope, that the brilliant Victory lately obtained by the gallant Lord Duncan, the Efforts of your Majesty's Subjects, their Loyalty, Spirit and Patriotism, will, under the Direction and Guidance of that Providence, whose kind protecting Hand hath often interposed between us and Danger, ultimately secure to your Majesty's Dominions the Blessings of Peace on safe and honorable Terms, so anxiously wished for by all Ranks and Descriptions of People.

Stamp-Office, January 2, 1798.

By an Act made for granting to His Majesty several additional Stamp Duties on Newspapers, and passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His said Majesty's Reign, it is, amongst other Things, enacted as follows:

“Whereas an Usage prevails amongst the Hawkers of News-Papers and other Persons, instead of selling the News-Papers, to let out the same for small Sums, to be read by different Persons, whereby the Sale of News-Papers is greatly obstructed; be it therefore further enacted, by the Authority aforesaid, that, from and after the said first Day of August, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-nine, if any Hawker of any News-Paper, or other Person, shall let out any News-Paper for Hire, to any Person or Persons, or to different Persons, or from House to House, he, she or they so offending shall forfeit and pay the Sum of Five Pounds, to be recovered and applied as any other Penalty or Forfeiture may be recovered and applied by any Law now in Force, relating to the Duties on stamped Vellum, Parchment and Paper.

His Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties think it necessary therefore to give this Public Notice,

That every Person who shall be found offending in this Respect against the Law will be immediately prosecuted to recover the Penalties incurred thereby, as the Act of Parliament directs.
