The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation hearing Date the Twenty-sixth Day of December, 1792, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Tea Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of I wenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Cifecers employed on Share for rating Men for the Officers employed on Shore for railing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majetty was also graciously pleased, by his said Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should senter themselves as aforesaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majetty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majetty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the said Month of February, 1793, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Ewenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to serve on board His Majelly's Ships thould be paid to board His Majolly's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themselves, so "that such Seaman or Seamen thould be taken for His Majesty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majetty's Sea Officers appointed to raife Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majesly's Ships or Vessels in the Ports or on the Coasts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of December; and it being judged ex; e lie: tor His Majetty's Service that the said Bounties and Reward mould be continued to be paid for some longer; His Majetty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended, from the said Thirty first Day of this instant December to the Iwenty-eighth Day of February next inclusive:—Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majetty in Council, HEREEAS it has been represented to His Majesty at this Board, That the malignant and infectious Difease, of the Nature of the Piague, which fane Time fince manifelted itself at Philadelphia in the State of Pertylvania, within the United States of America, has totally ceased; His Majetty, taking the same into Consideration, and being defirous to remove all Restraints upon Trade, so far as may be consistent with the Safety of His Cabiago in plantid, by and with the Advisor of His Subjects, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That the Quarantine laid by His Majetly's Order in Council, bearing Date the 18th Day of October, 1797, upon all Ships, Veffels, Perfons, Goods and Merchandize, arriving, or to arrive from Philadelphia, or any Port within the State of Pennivlvania, be taken off; and that all fuch Ships and Veffels be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings, without unpacking, opening and airing, and without performing any Quaisntine, as freely as they might have done in case such Order of the 18th Day of October, 1797, had not been made; any Thing ia the faid Order contained to the contrary notwithflunding,—And the Right Honorable the Lord's Commissioners of His Majurly's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the
