N.E. 30 Leagues) I sell in with and captured L'Avenure Letter of Marque, somerly the Onslow Guneanan, of Liverpool, mounting 10 Four and 2 Eight Pounders, and had on Board, when captured. 190 Men; the sailed from L'Orie t on Thursday last, in Company with Two other Privateers, one of 30, and the other of 24 Guns, and had not captured any Thing.
