7E, taking into Our most serious Confideration the just and necessary War in which We are engaged, for the Maintenance of the Indepen-dence of Our Grown, for the Defence and Protection of the Commerce; and of the Rights and Liberties, Civil and Religious, of Our Subjects, and putting Our Truft in Almighty God, that He will gracioufly blefs Our Arms, both by Sea and Land, have refolved, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, hereby command, That a Publick Faft and Humiliation be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom of Great Britain called Eng-land, Our Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwiek upon Tweed, on Wednefday the Seventh Day of March next; that fo both We and Our People may humble Ourfelves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon of Our Sins, and may, in the most devout and folemn Manner, fend up Our Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majelty, for averting those heavy Judgements which Our manifold Sins and Provocations have most juilly deferved ; and im-ploring His Bleffing and Atliftance on Our Arms, and for reitoring and perpetuating Peace, Safety and Prosperity to Us and Our Kingdoms: And We do thrictly charge and command, That the faid Publick Fast be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjects in England; Out Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed; as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation, and upon Pain of fuch Punishment as We may justly inflict on all fuch as contemn and neglect the Performance of fo feligious and neceffary a Duty. And for the better and more orderly folemnizing the fame, We have given Direc tions to the Moft Reverend the Archbishops, and the Right Reverend the Bishops of England, to compose a Form of Prayer fuitable to this Occasion, to be used in all Churches, Chapels, and Places of Publick a Duty.
