Lifbon, April 18.

HFre are arrived four French $\mathrm{M}: \mathrm{n}$ of War fromp Rochatle, and by them we uadxter flaypt, that the Gount d'E/free will' be here very fiddenly with a Squadron of 14 or 15 Ships more, which agrees with the aylyice the Erench conful here received by the lait Urifilary from Frants. The Spaniards having fince the conclufion of their Peace with France, drawn moth of their Troops that were employed in Catalonia towiards our Eronfiers, it hath given this Court lojne jealoufie; and we are told-that the Prince Regent, notwithltanding the aflurances of the spanifb Nipitter here,that the King of Spain has not the leaft thouglit of doing any thing that may prejudice the friendihip and good correfpondence at prefent eftablilht between the two Crowns, Ias fent Orders to the Governors of the Provinces, which border to spwin, to raife men, and to have a watchful cye upon the motions of the faid Spmiftroops. Madrid , May t. The Letters from Itaiy tell us, that the Republick of Genous continyep yars apptslon ive of the defigns, of the French ind this week arrixed here a Consiar with Letersstrontote Eount denteigur, Governor of wilan, wherein he reprefents the prefent flate of things on that fide, and prays he may have Orders how to bebave himielf, an cafe the French fhould, for the prolicuting any delignt they miy have iu hand, defire paffage for any pate of their Troops through the Territoftes under his Government. Though the Marriage of our King with Majannoicile d'Orieans is not yet folem; Iv leclared, set no body doubrs it; and the are told that befides the Ma: quis de los Balbaces, who is already at Piaristhe King has nominated the Maryuis d'Aforgus to gơ hin Anibalfaror to that Court, to perform the Ceremo ny of the Marriage, and to coiduce the Princeis to thet-rontiers, wherethe King will meet and receive her. Here is an Envoy fiom the Elector of Brinno denburgh, who foticites the payuehthe of the Aricets of the Subfidios due from this Crown to his Mafter, Which amount to 200000 Pieces of Fight ; he Jjas fleccedid fo far, as co obtain an aftignment upon the Galions which arcexpcoted the next month.

yienna, May 14. The Coure continues at Laxh emburg, where leveral Confultations have been held about the Alairs of Hungary, and we are told, it lass been refolved to confent to a farther Ceffation ce A:ms, which the Malecontents defire. The 12 th inItant Prince wriliam of Furfemburg (having fome days before obtained his liberty) parted from Eaden, and arrived here in the evening, where he has reccived the Vifits of a great many Perfons of Quality; ant will in a day or two be admitted to an Aud diende of the Empers.

Copenbagen, May 20. Yelterday the King returnled from Heffenburg, where he had been to view the new Fortifications that are raifing there, but with ar purpofe, as we underitand, to go back for scborewing three or four days. Francfort, isad 2r. From. Ratisbonne we have an account, that the Impsrial Commitioner had acquainted the Dyet, that the Ratifications of the Peace had been excianged at Nimeguen the 1 yth paft. The States of the Empue, and particularly they of Franconist have very nucla prefied the Emperor to draw his froops into his Hereditary Countries, that fo the French may hot have the pretence, which they now dratzanice of, to continue in the Empirc. The Desputi-s of the Cley of Strusburgh, who were fent purpelqiy to Fiexnashave obtained the Emperors Orders to the Duke of Loresix, to remove the Imperial Troops, that were received into Stribburgh for the defence of that City, from thence, the Magiltrates Javing undertaken to maintain at their own chargea conttant Garifon of 4000 men.
Cologne, May 23. The Frencib demand 300 thoufand Ciowrs of the Dutchy of fuliers, for Arrears of Contributions, and threaten to proceed to executfon, if the fame be not forthwith paid. In the meantime the French Troops that were lodged in that Countrey, and in this Diocefs, arc marched towards $W e f e l$, where th:y will pats the R bine; and the Marefchal de Crequi is coming down from Lorrain to coinmand them. The States of $\ddagger$ uliers and Bergs, which were affembled at bufeldorp, to find out fone wayta fatisfic the demand of the French, are broheu up, withourt being able to come to any refotution.

- Cologne, May 23 . The French have paffed the Rbine at Wrefel, and are marching in a Body of 12 or 14 thoufind men, under the command of Monficur Calvo, bowards the Coontrey of $A$ sarke, and by our next, it's probabte, we laill be able to tell you of fome actitot The Brendesburghs are hard at work at Minden, -to make godd the Fortifications in feveral places, Where they are thought defeftive.
- Bruffer, May 26. Yefterilay their Royal Highieffes returned hither from Mons and Engbien, and it's faid intens very fuddenly to go for Breda. Our Ietters from $\operatorname{Li}$ iege of the 24 th inftant tell us, that the Biihop of Strasburgb was expected there the next day, in inis way to Cologre; and that the Frencb Troops were marching from their feveral Quarters to the 2hine. Since the antival of the lalt Letters from Speiw, here has been a warm difcourfe of our having zuew Governor, and that the Marquis de los Balbaces, the Priace of Parma, or the Duke de Montalig, will bet the Perfoin.
Ampatrdam, May 23ъ The Letters which came by the two laft Pofts from Nimegueh, have very much keffened the topes mioft people had conceived of feeing the Peate of the North (peedily concluded ; yet not wholiy dalhed thern, for it is probable Monfieur akeinders may be ablo to effect that at Paris, which he could not with the Ererch Ambaffaior at Nimeguexn The Prace feems to depend upon it; for it is not doubted, but he is empowered to offer the utmoft the Elacker will be brought to conient to, and if that be notraccepted, the War pult go on, and the Points, intaiference muft be determined by the ficcels of it.
 Antbablardors continue thein meetings about adjuft ing thenexcation of the Peace, but hitherto without coning to any iffue. Above socoo French have
paffed the Rtive, and are marching to the Country of Marke. It is chought they will attack Minden. But in the mean time we arc expecting to hear what fuce cefs Monficur Meinders will have at faris.

Hague, May 26. The Treary of Commerce between Sueder and this State is not yet finilhed, as we told you in our lath, fome new difficulties having arifen, which has hindred the perfecting that work, which will howerer be done in a day ortwo. Yefterday the Heer van Leekwen, Ambaflador Extraordinary from this Stafe, to His Majefly' of Great Britain, took his leave of the States, and this day parted hence, in order to embark for Exgland. The French Ambalidor having by fereral Memurials preffed the States concerning the reflicution of the Bifhop of Liege's JuriddiEtion at Jraefticht, they have communicated the matter to the states of the feveral Provinces, to have their fentimencs upon it, before a final anfwer be given to thefaid Ambaffader.

Paris, May 27. The 21 inflant the Marquis de Villars, the Kings Ambaffador to Spain, parted from hence on his Journey thither. The 36th paft, the Marefchal de Vivome arrived at Marfeilles, where he found 28 Gallies almoft ready to put to Sea. . The Chevalier de Tourvile failed fome days before with fix Men If War from Tboulon for Majorca, to require the reftitution of feveral French Veffels taken by thofe Privateers fince the Peace. The Chevalier de Noxailles is made Lieutenant General of the Gallies. The Ceflation between our Troops and thofe of the Elector of Brandenburgh, having been expired fince the 20th inflant, the kipg, as we undecflard, has fent Orders to Monfieur Calvo to pafs the Phize, and to at tack his Electoral Highneffes Territorics; and the Companies of the Guards have Orders to march, and the Marefchal de Crequi to put timfelf at the head of. the Army. The Sieur Meyerkroone, the Danilh Envoy, had the laft week Audience of the King, and fince feveral Confirences with the Minifters of this Court, but with what fuccefs, we know not. The Dutch Amballadors were three days fince at St, Gere mains, to have Audience of the King, but were forced to return wishout feeing his Majefly. The Marefchal d'Efrades is returned from Nimeguen, where hc was the firft of the Kings Ambaffadors.
