I Request you will lay before their Lordships the accompanying Letter to me from Lord A. Beanclerk, giving an Account of his having captured and brought in here Le Mars, of Names, a new coppered Ship Privateer, mounting 16 Guns and 220 Men.

Dryad, Cork Harbour, February 9, 1798. SIR,

Have the Honor to inform you, that on the 4th Inftant, at Five A. M. Cape Clear N. E. Twenty Leagues, I captured Le Mars, a flout fastfailing Privateer, from Nantes, pierced for 20 Guis, had mounted 12 Twelves, 2 Eighteens, and 2 Twelve-Pound Carronades, with 222 Men: Hád been out Forty-nine Days, and not captured any Thing.
