way with fix Regiments of Horle, which will be joined by feveral Squadrons that come from Flanders. The Marquis de la Frefeliere was to part yelterday from Seun with the Artillery, being guarded by a Regiment of Horfe, and four Battalions of Fuot.

Cologne, 于une 9. The 7 th inftant the Marefchal de Crequiarrived at Nuis from Aix la Chapelle, where 37 'squadrons of Horic, $1_{4}$ Battalions of Foot, and a Train of Artillcry, confifting in so pieces of Cannon, were expected the next day. They will, as we are told, pafs the kbine ar a place called Steynen, not far froth Dufeldorp, a Bridge being preparing there for that purpole, The French Officers come hither in great numbers, to provide chemfelves with whatever they have occation for. Yellerday the French Troops quitced Grevenbrocke in the Country of fuliers, having firlt cbliged the Inhabitants to give them 2 or 3000 Crouns; and it is faid that the French now pret. nd Contributions as well of this Dioce 9 , às of $\mathcal{F} \mu-$ liers, for the months of fune, fuly, and Auguft. The Advices we receive from the Country of $M$ arke fay, That the Brandenburgb Forces, under the command of Liettenant General spaen were moving, in order to the polting themelves along the wefer, to guard the paffage of that River; that Monficur Calvo continued bis Quarters at Socft, expecting the coming up of the Marefchal de Crequi with the Forces he brings with him.

Bruffels, fune 13 . On Saturday laft the Duke we Villa Hesmofa begun his Journcy for Gelderland, and will be back here about the end of this month. The French are going to lay a Bridge over the Rbine, not far from Cologne, which puts that City into fome pain, left the French may have a defign upon them. We are expecting to hear what refolution the States General will take, upon the laft Memorial of Don Emanuel de Lyra, concerning the Reftitution of Mraeftricht, in which, it's faid, feveral of the Provinces are very inclinable to gratifie the Crown of spaiv. Yellerday the Prince of Orange came to Breda, to view the new Fortifications that are making there, and which, it's faid, advance apace.

Fague, Fune 13. The States of Folland are Summuned to meet the 16 th inftant, which is much foumer, than was intended when they feparaced, of which the reafon is not declared, but it's believed that the Memorials of the French Ambaffador concerning the Conrributions, and the re-ftablifhing the Jurifdiction of the Bihhop of liege at Maeftricht and that of the Spanifh Envoye, prefling the reltitution of that City to the King his Maffer, are the occafions of it; and the Prince of Orange is expreeted here againft that time. Since the arrival of the Bihop of Strafburgh at Cologne, things are obferved to have very much change. there, and that is one realon why the Imperialifts make the more difficulty to evacuate Bonne; at Nimeguen the Conferences between the Imperial and Freach Ambaffadors concerning the execution of the Peace, are difcontinued.
parit, fune 14. The Sieur Meinders, the Brandenburgh Miaifter, has fent an Exprefs, to give the Elector an account of the refolutions of this Court, as they have been declared to him, with relation to the Peace of the North, and will expect here his return. O. Sunday laft the Marquis de los Ballaces, Ambaffa 'or Extraordinary of Spain, made his Pubfick Entry into this City, his Train and Equipage being very rich and numerous. The Cardinal d'Eftree, who has been fome time at the Court of Bavaria, on the part of the King, is returned, and has informed
him of the fate he left things in, in thofe Parts. If is faid that the King has given the Government of all Lorrain to the Marefchal de Crequi, which there is a difcourfe of uniting to the Crown for ever. On Saturday laft one of the Guards du Corps was broken upon the Wh.el, being Condemned for Poyfonings; of which he had the secret, and could empeyfon Plates, Dilhes, Cups and Glafes, which he had very often practifed.

Paris, fune 17. The Negotiation concerning the Peace of the North feems at pref'nt quite broken off, and now all the ralk is of the carrying on the War. The 7 th inftant the Marefchal de Crequi arrived at Nuis, from thence he parted again the next morning for $W e f e l$, with between 30 and 40 Squadrons of Horle, leaving the Infancry and the Artillery to fotlow, under the Command of the Marquis de la Frejeliere.

Plymouth, Fune 6. Yefterday arrived here Sir Fobn Narborough, with reveral of the Kings Ships urider his Command, from the Streights.
Portfmouth, Fune 10.This day Sir Fobn Narborough with the Squadron under his Command, being about 1s Sail, arrived at Spitthead.

Wbiteball, Fune 9. This afternoon his Excellency the Marquis d' Auronches, Amballador Extraordinary from the Crown of portugal, was Condueted ta his Audience of Their Majefties, (in the Banquetting Houre)by the Earl of Sbrewsbury, and Sir Cbarles Colterel Malter of the Ceremonics, being brought Prom weft minfter in the Kings Coach of Scate, follows ed by his own, and a greac Train of orhers, with fix Horfes apiece.
