

Wesel, in order to his repassing the *Rhin*; and orders have been given to provide all things necessary for their subsistence in the Diocesis of *Cologne*. The 29th inst, the *Sieur Bielke*, Ambassador Extraordinary from the King of *Sweden* made his publick entry into this City, being accompanied by the *Marschal d' Estrades*, and the Master of the Ceremonies; and the first instant he had his publick audience of their Majesties, being conducted threunto by the *Count de Marjan*. The 2 instant the *Sieur Meinders*, the Elector of *Brandenburg's* Envoy had a private Audience of the King. The next day *Signior Contarini* Ambassador from the State of *Venice* took his leave of the King, in order to his return home, after his audience was done, the King knighted the Ambassador; the Ceremony was, the Ambassador kneeled, and the King laying his Sword upon each Shoulder, said, by *St. George* and *St. Michael* I charge you, and deliver'd to him a Sword and Belt, and then embracing him, put a Coller of the Order about his neck. The King has suppress'd the Chambers of the Edit of the Parliaments of *Toulouse*, *Bourdeaux*, and *Grenoble*, and has commanded that the Councillors which compose them, shall be received into these Parliaments. The King has caus'd a Camp to be prepar'd near *Poissy* for the Troops of his Household: He was the 1 instant to visit it, and while he was there, four Companies of the *Guards du Corps*, the *Gen'darms* the light Horse, two Companies of the *Musketeers*, &c. arriv'd thire; these Troops are all commanded by the *Duke de Noailles* Captain of the first Company of the *Guards du Corps*.

Plimouth, July 25. There is a report that the *Algerines* have taken some Merchant Ships in the *Chantrel*, and among others a *Virginia* man. Yesterday came in the *Lyon* of *London*, bound for *Falmouth*, with two or three foreign Vessels.

Bridlington, July 24. By a Vessel which arriv'd here two days since from *Stockholm*, we have an account, that the *Swedes* and *Danes* Fleets had met, that the former being much inferior to the other in number as well as strength of Ships, did not think fit to hazard an engagement, but made haste to retire into Port; that the *Danes* followed them, and took a *Swedes* man of War, mounted with 30 odd Guns. That as to the Peace, there is very small appearance that it will be concluded in *Schonen*: the demands of the Parties being so very distant from one another, that it's very unlikely they can be brought to close. That the *Swedes* particularly insist to have the *Duke of Holstein*, as a Sovereign and Independent Prince, admitted to the Treaty, which the *Danes* will not allow; saying, that that Prince holds the *Dutchy of Sleswic* of the King of *Denmark*, and being by that means his Vassal, ought not to Treat with him upon an equal foot. So that the Ambassadors, who had met at *London*, were going to separate, leaving the *French* Ambassador very much troubled that their conferences had not been more successful.

Pendennis, July 24. On Monday last came in here the *Carlisle* of *London*, *Charles Swanzey* Master bound for *Jamaica*; the *Bridgewater*, *James Simonds* Master bound for the *Barbadoes*; the *Frog* of *London*, *Richard White* Master from the *Canaries*; the *Port-o-Port Merchant*, *Humphrey Seal* Master, the *Pearl*, *John Cranbrook*, and the *Fountain*, *John Warren*, all three of *London*; and bound for *Port-o-Port*.

Deale, July 29. This morning arriv'd here a

Vessel from *Hamburg*; the Master (who is very well known here) reports that the Troops of the King of *Denmark* and the Elector of *Brandenburg* have besieged the City of *Hamburg* with an Army of 16000 men; and that the Magistrates had caus'd the Boors houses without the Town to be burnt, and were putting themselves into the best posture of defence they could. This is a piece of News of so great consequence, that we cannot omit giving you an account of this report, though it is so surprising that people can hardly give credit to it till it be confirm'd.

Whitehal, July 26. His Majesty has been pleas'd to change the Title of Earl of *Falmouth*, which you have been told, His Majesty had confer'd upon the *Lord Roberts*, and instead thereof, to create him Earl of *Rudnor*. His Majesty has been likewise Graciously pleas'd, as a mark of His Grace and Favour to the *Lord Viscount Tarmouth*, to create him Earl of *Tarmouth*.

Swansey, July 24. Yesterday were executed at *Cardiff* in this County, *John Evans*, and *William Lloyd*, two *Popish Priests*, according to the Sentence pass'd upon them at the last Assizes.

On Wednesday night last two prisoners, the one condemn'd the last Assizes at *Carmarthen*, and the other brought in since, for stealing a Mare, burnt the prison door just in the middle, and so made their escape; the condemn'd man had Manacles and Bolts on his Legs, and was chained to a stone of a hundred weight, his name is *James Morgan*, black Hair, little short Beard, small black Eyes, smiling countenance, lisping in his Speech, having two Coats, one Gray, and the other sad coloured, with a large brimm'd black Hat. The other's name is *John Davies*, flaxen Hair, a little cut in his Chin, a slender man, very ill clothed, and bare-footed. Whoever can give notice of them to the Goaler, shall have 40 s.
