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Dartmouth, March 26.

Here is newly arrived at this Port a Privateer under the Command of Captain *Parris*, who has brought with him a supposed Prize; but a pretended Offender of about 220 Tuns; laden with Wine and Salt, but (but what adds to the suspicion) produces no Pass-port from Offend.

Bristol, March 27. An Hamburger of 250 Tuns in her return from *Lisbon*, ran unfortunately a ground within a League of *Kings road*, but 'tis believed the next full Tide will bring her off again without any damage.

Yesterday arrived a Dutch Prize laden with Salt, of 300 Tuns; another of 400 Tuns in her way hither sprang a leak, and was forced to put in at *St. Ives*, but is expected here every Tide.

West-Corw, March 27. Yesterday arrived here the *Paradox* Freegar, Leonard Guy Captain, bringing in with him a Dutch Ship called the *St. Katharine* of Rotterdam, bound homewards from *Lisbon* laden with Sugar, Sweet Oyl, Chyna, and other Oranges and Lemons, &c. she was seized on in *Sandham Bay* under the Fort, to which she yielded, and the Men put on shore there; but the Vessel afterwards brought thence by the *Paradox*.

Rome, March 8. The late promotion of Cardinals, though it has given much satisfaction to the Generality, who are pleased with the filling up of all the Vacancies; has not a little disgusted others, especially the Great Duke of *Tuscany*, who having lost two Cardinals out of his Family, viz. his Uncle and Brother, had great hopes his Holiness would have conferred one of their fallen Caps, upon the Prince *Matthias*. Cardinal *Chigy* and *Ion Mario*, are endeavouring by sending to him the Marquis *Patrioti*, their confident, to assure him, that it was not their fault, that he failed of the satisfaction he expected; but that it proceeded wholly from the fixed humor of the Pope.

The dangerous condition of the Pope, has already begun to put the Cardinals in mind of a new Creation, the discourse of the Town proposing the Cardinals *Barberin* and *Farnese*, as two persons that more eminently may be pitch upon as Competitors for the Chair. Prior *Bichi*, who was preparing to take leave of his friends, for to enter upon his employment in the *Venetian* War, has upon this occasion resolved to defer his departure for a longer season.

The Dutchess *de Ceri* being fled from hence with the Marquis *de Santinelli*, is since married to him, and is now safely arrived at *Mantua*, her Estate in this City, is by Order from the Pope seized on, to the value of 40000 Crowns.

From *Naples* we are inform'd, that the Viceroy there, has by Order from their Catholick Majesties, with the assistance of the Merchants; got together the sum of 500000 Ducats, which is to be lent or returned part of it into *Flanders*, and part into *Germany*, to be employed in raising Forces.

The fourth Instant, Cardinal *Caraccioli*, upon an engagement to pay 8000 Crowns per Annum pension to Cardinal *Chigy*, was chosen Archbishop of *Naples*.

Warsaw, March 12. The 7th Instant gave beginning to our Diet here, with the accustomed Solemnities, and immediately proceeded according to form to the Election of their Marshal or Speaker, and the 9th Instant, constituted the Heer *Katowitz Pilans Litowsky* in that Employment, and then fell upon Business. A motion has been made, that the

Crowns Treasurer and the Receivers of the publick Revenues may be brought to an Account.

From *Ukrania* we are informed, That the Royal and Rebel Cossacks have had of late frequent Encounters, but always to the disadvantage of the Rebels, whose Interests decline much, and considerable numbers of them are daily returning to their obedience; and that a designe was lately laid for the betraying and delivery of the Garrison *Bialaciekiew* to the Rebel Cossacks, but by the timely discovery of it by an old woman, good order was taken for its prevention, and four of the principal persons concerned in the management of that Conspiracy, apprehended and empalled.

Vienna, March 13. Besides the former Envoyé from *Poland*, called *Praochmobskej*, who came accompanied with eight other persons, here is also a Senator of that Kingdom upon the same errand, both of them employing their cares and interests to obtain Succors for their Master; they assure us, that the Diet is already begun at *Warsaw*, but cannot yet make any guess what success it is like to have.

The Spanish Ambassador has received very considerable sums of money to be employed in levying of Forces.

The States of *Hungary* are still at *Neustat*, but are not yet satisfied concerning their Grievances, and 'tis believed, unless His Imperial Majesty interpose, they are like to part with as little satisfaction as they came together; and deter the farther consideration of them till the next year.

From *Erford* they tell us, that the Prince Elector of *Moyence*, being in that City with a party of a thousand Horse, is settling the Affairs of that place in the best Order possible; and has ordered the speedy reparation of the Citadel. The Princes of *Saxe* have sent thither their Deputies, to complement his Highness, and the Neighbouring Counts are most of them arrived there in person, to attend his Commands, whose stay there is yet uncertain.

Some few days since arrived here the Marquis *Pio*, and had Audience from the Emperor, but after two or three days left the Town; being it seems invited from hence by Colonel *Dickewald* a Swede, upon an old quarrel risen between them in the Wars where they formerly served; but were hindered from deciding it with their Swords; and so that purpose took post, intending to meet in some part out of the Emperors Hereditary Countries; the Marquis *Pio* taking with him for his Seconds, the Marquis *de Grana*, and the Count *de Heberstein*, and the Colonel for his, Monsieur *Hoffkirchen*, and Lieutenant Colonel *de Bernshaw*; three Lutherans against three Roman Catholicks; all of them to engage equally on Horse-back with their Swords. The Emperor having notice of their intentions, has taken the best care possible to prevent them, but 'tis believed to little purpose, the place appointed being not known to any, but the persons engaged.

Cadix, March 6. Three days since sailed hence 8 Gallions, three Peraches, and 21 Sail of Merchants richly laden from the *Indies*, and the same day came in 3 *St. Malo* Merchants from *Tunis* with Wheat, 9 more came out of the *Streights* with them bound homewards, whereof two of 24 Guns and 50 Men apiece, the other small Batque Fishermen laden with Oyles.

Captain *Herbert* with the *Pembroke* Freigate, is now in this Port newly returned from a fresh dispute with a Zealand Man of War of 34 Guns, and 180 Men, with whom he fought, about twenty days since in sight of this Bay, from Two in the Afternoon, till the Night put an end to the Days work, all that night the Freigate carrying out a light for the Zealanders, and the next morning being to the windward
