Rempilito is retrucd hither fr.m Charlergy, where the lids beem to give orders for the repairing the Furticutions of that plaze, and the providing quarters for 1500 Foot, who are to come thither from Luxemburg, where their ronm widd be fupplyed by e-rtain German Troops, which are taken into the fervice of this Crown.

Amplerdam, Sept. 14. We have Letters of the $2: 1$ of fuly from Martenico in the weft Indies, which give us an account, that the Count $d^{\prime} E f$ tree arrived there about the beginning of the month with ten Sail; that he was gone again from thence, and that he would be back in three months, but that it was not known whether he took his courfe. The Elector of Brandenburg has written a fecond Letter to the States dated at Pofldam the 4th inftant, in which he tells them, that he expects from them a compenfation in money for the damages his Counbries have fuftained in the War, which this State fhinks there lies not any obligation upon them to give. What the confequence of this his Electoral Wlighuelfes pretenfions may be, time muft fhew.

Hague, Sept. 19. This day the Prince of Orange parted hence for Breda, to meet the Princels of Orange, who is returning from Aix la Cbapelle. A great many people die at $A m f f e r d a m$; the laft week the number of the buried were 322 , which is much more than ufual, though there appears not any contagious Diffemper. Many people apprehend there will atife differences between this State and the Elector of Brandenburg; He now demands the Arsears of Subfides due to him, and has defired the affiftance of Fraxce werein; and befides, has fummoned theProvinces, who were conquered by the French $i_{n}$ the late War, to pay their qugta’s of the faid Subfidies (the other four Provinces having declared they have paid theirs) and in default thereof, threahgng them with Military exccution.

Puri, Sept. 20. This day the Queen of Spain toek her leave of the King and Queen, and begun her journy for Spain, and lodges this, night at Nemokrs. The Dutchels of Hanouer intends to pals the Winter here, and will be lodged in the Palace of Iuxemburg. There is much difcourfe at Court con--qeaning the Duke of Maxtua's putting Cazal into -ourkings hands.
