Sleur d'Amerongen go first to the King of Denmark, at his Quarters at Pinnenburg, to endeavour by his good Offices to adjust matters between his Marjesty and the Town of Hamburg. The States have likewise sent Orders to their Minister at Copenhaguen to repair forthwith to the Danith Court, to athis the Sieur d'Amerongen in his Negotiation, who will be the more acceptable, as having been formerly Ambassador in Denmark, where he was honoured with the Order of the El, phant. This In orning the Prince of Orange went hence for Soessive, and to morrow the Princels follows; and it's thought then Highmess will not ireturn till the 12th of the next Month,

Hague, Oftob. 203 Here is much talk of a.Letter, which was, lome days fince, fent to the States General, by an unknown hand; representing at large the ill posture these Provinces are fallen into, which is the realion the neighbouring Princes have not the fame regard for this Republick as formerly; witnefs the threatning Letters of Spain, Denmark, . Brandenburg, and Lunenbarg, that the only way to reftore the state into the Condition it was formerly in, is to enter into a firici Allyance with France, in purloance of which the French King would maintain 150000 Men in Arms, and this State need not to keep above 10000 Foot and 6000 Horfe and Dragoons; that by this means, these Provinces would be able to defend themselves against whomfoever it be; that this Allyance should be confirmed every year, by mutual Oaths, by the French Ambaffador here and the Ambaffador of this State at Paris; and this being done the Subjects of this Republick should have alone the Trade in that Kings Dominions, to the exclusion of all others. The French Ambaflador, about the fame time, pre--fented a Memorial to the States concerning an Alliance, which the King his Mafter offers to enter into with this State; which feems disposed rather to close with England, as its true Interest.

Paris, Oftob. 21. This day the Prefident Colbert parts hence for Bavaria, where it's faid he goes to conclude the Treaty of Marriage between the Dauphin and that Electors Sifler, which done, the Duke *de Pillerøy* will be fent as Ambaffador Extraordinary to conduct her hither. There is a difcourfe at Court that the King will take a journey to Mets toward the end of this year, or the beginning of the next. Prince William of Furftemburg goes hence in few days for Padua, where it's faid he has fome Affairs of his own to look after, but its believed, that's only a pretence, and that he goes for Bavaria, to treat there fome private matters. The 10th the Count d' Eftree arrived with the Ships under his command at Breft, from the West Indies, which he fent his Son, the Marquis d' Estree, to give the King advice of. And we are told, Orders are fent him to lay up the Ships that are come home with him. The 11th instant the Queen of Spain arrived at Bourdeaux, "whiere fhe would flay two or three days. The Spanish Ladies, who came to receive her, have palled the Frontiers, and will expect her Maj fly at Bayonne, but the Grandees come on to meet her. It is faid the King of Spain will come incognito's with five or fix perfons only, to Fontarabie, to fee This Queen there, and then will return to Burgis, where he will publickly receive her, and confummate his Marriage. The 18th, the Princels of Hannouer arrived here. The King of Denmark and the Gity of Hamburg have accepted the Mediation of the Duke of Hano er, for the accommodating the differences between them; the King has likewife offered them his, The Marcíchal d' Humieres arrived three days fince at Court; but the King has Teur him back to *Lorrain* and Alface.

Plimouth, Oil. 10. Vefterday came into this Port the Ruby, Captain Allen Commander, from cruiffing to the Weftward, and the Phenix Captain Blage, from Bilboa, The Weather is at prefent yery Tempestuous:
