IS Majefly has thought fit by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 24 of September laft park, with the advice of his Privy Council, to Detlate, That His Majefly has by his Letters Parents, Dated the 9 of December 1678, appointed Ambony Row, Naibanael Folkfou, Contored Braifbury, Robert Nori, and Thomas Ducke of L and Lfquires, to be ColleGots of His Majeflies Kevenue arifing by Fire-Hearths and Stovès as thall become due at and after Michaelmas 1679 for the term of 5 years to be computed from Lady-day 1679; And that therefore His Majeflies Will and Pleasure is, that His faid Revenue, oue at and after Michaelmas 1599, during the faul Term of 5 years, that be ColleGed by the Perfons above mentioned, their Deputies, Agents, and Subflitures : And that all Arrears of the faid Revenue due at or before Lady day 1:ft paft be ColleGed by *Jobn Pory* and *Edward Buckeloy* 1fg; furviving Farmers of the faid Revenue, purfuant to His Majeflies Letters Patents to them. And His Majefly doth friefly require; all Juftices of the Peace, chief Magifitraes, Headboroughs, Conflables, and all other Officers to be aid puttes, Agents and Stovers within cach Coursy, City and Place in England, Wa'es, and Bewiek upon Twred, and in cale of fly refulal, His Majeflies to find ColleGora, their Deputies, Agents or Subflitures : according to the AGs of Parliament in that behall) fr. m time to time to enter and make perfect 'urveys for the numbring all Fire-Hearths and Stoves within cach Coursy, City and Place in England, Wa'es, and Bewiek upon Twred, and in cale of fly refulal, His Majeflies Officers abovementioned wiews and Surveys may be duily and throughly made. And His Majefly doth farther require that all Hiegal and whoue Certificates be forthwith Dicharged, to the confiel Duty, which he ought to pay by Law. And that all Perfers that flavilopp fe or injure the faid ColleGors or any of their Officers in the due txecution of the faid AGs of Parliaments, be punifhed according to Law.

The 8 French Galleys, defigned for Genoua, put to Sea yefterday, but were the fame day forced back again by the ill Wea her. Six M n of War and two Fire-Ships are fitting out at Theulon, who are to go for Tripoli to make a Peace with thole Corfairs, or elle to commit what Holilities they can upon them.
