Prague, Nou, 1. Ount Lebrowits, whom the Emperor is fending to the Court of Bawaria, will be difpatched in a day or two. It is faid he will propole a Marriage between the Elector and the Emperors Daughter, or at leaft endeavor to prevent that Electors marrying with a French Lady, What was faid of Chancellor Smidt, and other of the Eles otors Officers who are lookt upon to be favourers of the French Interests, being difgraced, is not confirmed.

Prague, Nev. 4. This Court is much alarmed at the news a Courier fent by the Duke of Lorrain brought them, which is, that she French domand 'you thouland Horins of the Country of Brilgon, four whereof they pretend to be due before the Peace, and three fince ; a Sum that Country is in its prefent ruined condition altogether unable to pay. We are told that the Emperor has refolved in the prefent polture of affairs, not to intermeddle in chismatter, and to leave the Country to make the best composition it can ; but in the mean time most people are of opinion that if the French proceed after this manner the Peace cannot lafting.

Ratisbonne, Nov. 7. On Friday last asrived here the Marquis de Vitry Envoy Extraordinary from the Moft Chriftian King to the Emperor, and the next day continued his journy, intending to pals through Bayunia. The fame day came hither Count Lobcowits, from Prague, who understanding that Monfieur Co'bert the French Ambassador was arrived at Muncken, the Elector of Bavaria's Court, immediately haftened his journy thither.

The Prince of Furstemberg parted hence for Meniz. Hamburg, Nov. 12. By the Interims Recess be-tween the King of Denmark and this City, it is agreed,

I. That his Majefly and this City [buil remain unprejudiced in their several Rights and Pretentions; and that the Point of Homage Jhall be amicably determined, by Treaty, or by an ordinary Process before the Chamber of Spire; and that in the mean time this City shall enjoy

 Neutrality and free Commerce as formerly.
IL That this City with a thankful Acknowledgement of His Majeffiergood Will towards them, fhall remain in an bumble devotion towards him, and shall to the ut-most of their power further his good, and prevent any

avil ibey know likely to bappen to him. III- That for greater manifestation of this poir Devotion, this City shall fend a formal Deputation to **h**is Majesty.

IV, That this City, in confideration of his Majesties being pleased to receive them again into his favour, Shall pay him 220000 Crowns at four Terms, the first Payment to be made immediately after the Ratifying the

Receis; the second within fix Months after; and the third, and half at the end of the other fix Months. V. That his Majefly jhalf quit all his Pretentions upon any Lands, which this City at prefent holds, in particular or in common with the City of Lubeck; shall releafe the Ships flopt at Gluckladt, and shall Perifer the Parcel with or with day. Ratifie this Recels within eight days.

Hamburg, Nov. 14. On Saturday last the Deputies of this City were to wait upon the King at his quarters at *Pinnenberg*, and bling admitted to Audience, ipsketohim in the following words,

Moft Serene, and Meft Potent King, Moft Gracious Lord.

Hereas your Royal Majefty is by the Merry of Gad, bappily arrived in these your Dukedom, and conjequently in the Neighborhood of this City of Hamburg, and bash caused Propulais, confisting in three Roints, to be made to the faid City, and halb defired their Refolution thereupon 1 And whereas the first Point, through the shoriness of the time, and for other Reafons, could not be determined at prefint; and that your Majeriy hash therefore been gracicully peaked to refer the same to an amicable Agreement, or to a degal Determination; and in the mean time so remove the displeasure you had taken against the said City; and by an Interims Receis gracioufly to agree, That as well the Rights and Protentions of your Mujesty, as of the faid City, Shall nernain unprejudiced; Whe Burghermafors, and Rapids Depunies, do in the name of them-lelves, and of all the Bungbers, appear before your Ma-jesty, and do promise faithfully to observe the satd Interims Receis in all its Points and Claufes; and perticularly to bear your Majesty most bumble and becoming Devotion; That to the utmost of their power, they still further your Majesties Good, and binder all ill and detriment from bappening to your Majesty. Prouided this City be left in a quiet and undiffurbed enjoyment of their Neutrality and Commerce, and of all their Rights and Priviledges; and that the Rights of his Imperial Majesly and the Empire be maintained.

To which the King rotumed a very kind Answer ; Affured them of his good Will; and that he would punctually observe on his part this Agreement. After which the Deputies were treated at Supper by the Court-Marshall, and fo returned hither. Strasburg, Nov. 10. The French have lately changed their Garifons in Lutzelftein, Lichtenberg, aid Dachsburg; and it's faid they intend to quit aid raze the two latter; While they work every day harder and harder on the Fortifications of Hunwirgen, Schlestadt, Bitsch, and Homburg, and reclive great Sunis of Mony from France for the encou regement of that Work Several p. rions of qua lity have lately paffed through this City on their way from France to the C urt of Bavaria, where the Marriage between the Dauphin and that Elefors Siller is treating, and as every body believes is as good as concluded. The French that pais chrough here fay, the Dauphin will come as far as Nancy to meet his Bride, and that he will refide there, the king giving him the Government of Lorrain, Alface and Burgundy.

Bruffels, Nov. 14. The States of Brabani cannot hitherto be prevailed with to grant the 1200 thousand Florins which his Excellency has demanded of them, and it's faid they defer taking a final Refolution therein till they fee whether any fupplies come from Spain, without which, they think the Moniesthefe Provinces can raife will fignific little. The Letters from Liege give a large description of the milery of that Country, that many Villages are wholly deferted of Inhabitunts, and that more will be, in cafe the French winter there, as according to all appearance their intention is; at the fame time the Elector of Cologne has fent fome of his Guards to quarter in the Dillricht of Franchimont, to oblige those Inhabitants to pay the Arrears of Contributions due to the Imperialis, which his Electoral Highness was forced to make good to them before they quitted Bonne. From Cologne they write, that the French are fo far from leaving that Diocels, that they have fummoned the Inhabitants to bring in to their feveral Garilons, which they augment daily, great quantities of Forage and Wood. Monficur Colbert the French Ambaffador Is arrived at the Court of Bavaria, whither the Emperor has likewife fent Count Lobcowits; we shall quickly fee which of the two will be the most fuccelsful, though people here generally b lieve the French Interests will prevail, and that the Marriage between the Dauphin and the Princels of Bavaria will be concluded.

Hague, Nov. 17. The States of Holland are now furmoned to meet on the 22'inftant, against which time the Prince of Orange is expected here. The Duke of Monmouth has spent leveral days with his Highnels at Dieren and at Soefidike, and when his Highnels comes hither, his Grace goes back to Otrecht. The Actions of the East India Company, which within these few days fell fr. m 350 to 330, are now come up again to 335. The French give out that at the meeting of the States of Holland an Allfance between this State and France will be proposed, which a few days will show.

Plimouch, Nov. 71 Yefterday His Majefties Ship the Sival:ow, Captain Fowler Commander, came into this Port with the reft of the Merchant Ships

bound for the *Canaries* and other parts, who are now expecting a fair wind to purfue their deveral Voyages.

Piimouth, Nov. 9. This evening the Fleet of Merchant Ships that was here, confilting in above too tail, put to Sca with their Convoy, the Wind being very fair.

Tork, Nov. 8. On Thursday in the evening their Royal Highness came hither, having been received at their entring into this County by the High-Sheriff, and many of the Nobility and other perfons of quality, and met by several others on the Road. Four miles from hence our Sheriffs met their Royal Highness, and waited upon them hither. Upon their arrival they were faluted with 21 great Guns from the Casses to them; and our Lord Mayer was to wait upon their Royal Highness at their Lodging. This day our Archbilhop has invited his Royal Highness to Dinner, (his House being three miles from hence) whither a great many perfons of quality are preparing to attend him. On Monday their Royal Highness, on Tuess at Rickmond, and on Wednesday at Durbam.

Eondon, Nov. 10. There are Letters from the Canaries dated the 28 of September, which wholly contradict the Report of the Matter of a Veffel put lately into Fa.mouth, concerning the pluntiful Vintage he faid they had there; and on the contrary affure us, that the Vintage would in all probability be very late, and not begun till the latter end of Oldber, and that it was the general belief there would not be fo much Wine made this year by a fourth part as was the laft.

Whiteball, Nov. 10. The laft week the Marquis d'Aronches Ambaflador-Extraordinary from the Crown of Portugal, had Aulience of their Majeflies, whom his Exceller cy acquainted in the name of the Prince Regent and Queen of Portugal with the Marriage concluded between the Duke of Savoy and the Infanta of Portugal.
