## Naples, Nov. 7.

Ur Viceroy, the Marquis de los Veles, is continu d in this Government for three years longer, and has thereupon been complimented by all the parfons of Quality here. The City of Meffine begins to flourish again, a great many strangers of divers Trades, being come thither, and supplying the rooms of the Meffines, who have, lome voluntarily, and some by confirment, left that City.

Genoua, Nov. 11. This Senate has fent to the Duke of Turfis, to acquaint him, that feveral French Gallies are to winter here, and to define his Squadron will not come hither, to avoid all diffute between them and the French, concerning Salutes.

Legora, Nov. 13, We have an account of an odd accident lately Jappened to a Privatier of 30 Guns, and 200 men, commanded by Captain Criyellyer of Savoy; which was thus; A quarrel happening between the Captain and the Gunner of the Vellel, and the former giving the other a box on the ear, he refolved to be revenged, and by means of a Train of Powder, and a piece af Match conyeniently placed, to blow up the Ship, which he didaccordingly, the Captain, Ship, and all his men being blown up ; but the Author of this wickednefs rook care to efcape himfelf.

Venice, Nev. 17. The Senate has ordered the Prayers of 48 hours, to be made in the gr at Church of st. Mark, to implore the Divine Goodnels to plivert the Plague, which has already infected the frontiers of *Italy*; and in the mean time, no perfon is permitted to come hither, without a Letter of Health.

Pragus, Nov: 18. The Count of Starenberg is made Governor of Philipsburg. We have no further account than what we gave you in our laft from Municke. The Plague continues very violent at Vienna, and in Hungary. At Newsfadt there are vety few Inhabitants left.

Hamburgh, Nov. 28. This City has made its first payment of 70000 Crowns to the King of Denmark. The Commissioners of Swedun, and the Princes of Lunenburg have had feveral meetings, and its faid, things are in a fair way of being adjusted between them, and confequently, that Bremen will be fuddainly reflored to the Swedes. The Elector of Brandenburg goes on with his disbauking of his Troops, fome Regiments of his Edectoral Highnels, are come into the Territories of the Duke of Meeklenborg, and have taken Quarftein, who have had their Refidence here for fame years, parted hence to Rbinebeck, but wuether they will continue there, or regum hither is not known The Town of Straelford is in much perplexity, Count Coningsmark having taken away their priledges, and cau'ed feveral of their Magistrates tobe Arrested, and the Deputies they fent to the King of Swed.n, not having been admitted into his prefence.

Strasburg, Nov. 22. It was faid fome time fince, that there was great likelihood of accommodating matters between the most Christian King and the Duke of Lorrain, and that the latter would be specdily reftored to his Countreys, but at prefent there is nothing fpoken of it, and those that pretend to know best, tell us, that the Duke of Lorrain remains fixed in this refolution; never to return to his Gountreys, unleis it may be upon fuch conditions, as become a Sovereign Prince. It is the news of these parts, that the French King will be at Mets or Nancy before Christman, though others think it is only the Dauphin that comes thither to meet his Bride the Princess of Bavaria; for it is certainly faid, that that marriage is fo fat agreed, as to want only the approbation of the molt Chri-Itian King, which fome would doubt of, because the Elector of Bavaria has not embraced the Propofalsmade to to him of a Marriage between him and Madamoiselle de Valois, the Duke of Orleans Daughter.

Cologne, Nov. 28. Prince William of Furfemberg remains till here, expecting the return of an Express which he fent, with Letters to the French Court. Three days fince the Chapter of this Dioce's being Affembled, he affured them, that the French would in 15 days, or three weeks at fartheft, quit this Archbilhoprick. But that they meant to keep Wele's, Lingen, and Dueren, till fuch time as they are fatisticd for the arreas of Contributions due to them.

Our Letters from *Bavaria* give an account, that the Marriage between the Dauphin and that Princels, was as good as concluded.

Liege, Nov. 28. The French are now in good earnelt going to quit these parts; the French Refident has taken his leave of our Magistrat.s, and allured them, that Vifet, Verviers, and Huy will be very fuddainly evacuated; but as for Dimint, the French seem resolved not to quit it, till the Spaniards deliver them Charlemont, as was agreed by the Peace.

Bruffels, Dec, 5. The Commiffioners appointed by his Excellency, are now at *Courtray*, and have had feveral Conferences with those of *France*, for the adjufting the limits, in which they have not as yet been able to come to any agreement. Our Letters from *Liege* give us an account, That the French are leaving that Countrey, as likewife *Juliers* and *Gologns* On Sunday arrived our Spanish Letters; which informed us that our King had confummated his Majelty at *Burgos* and that the ir Majesties were expected the 10 inflant at *Madrid*, where
