Lof, rhe Nobillty and Gentry (fothe in thcir Coaches, and fom: on Hotfback) whole number ttill inereafed as thery adtynectit tawards the place so that the Horfemen filiced alf the fong Sands, and from thehce to the Yinks of Leitb, (being three long miles) at the Ealt end of which, the flanding Forces, with the Militia Regiment of this Ciry, were drawn up in excellent order, by General Dalyel, Licutcuant-Gencrals and Commander in chief of His Majeftics Forces here, as were likewife 26 Companiss of the Trained Bands of this City, nceat the Quarrel-Hoker,which taterer were after wards formed inte a Lane for thrir Royal Higneffes to perfs throwigh, to the Watec-Gate. As foon as their Royal tighneffes came to the middle of the Long Sands, the Lizatenantecesurral came to compliment the Duke, whe lighted out of his Coach, and mounted on hor rebark, $r$ ding along the front of the Forces. As he paffed, the Troops and Aftillery (planted on the right wing) made fer ral dr'cherges:Then the' Stips in the Harbor of Lethb, and a banceiy of 16 Great Guns, upon one of the old Bafflonsthere, did the like, which gave che fignal to the $x$ athle here, umere immediately the Great Royal Standard was fet up, and the Great Guns wore fire,ts as they continued to be, till their Royal Highneffes arrived tat the Patace, All along the High-way from Leith to this place, were nany thourands of prople, who joyncd with thé Forces in ch-ir acclamations of long Life and Profperity to the King; and of teealth and Welcome to the Duke and Durhels; at the Water-Gate their Royal Highnefies nere tcecived by the Lord Prowofty and the Magiffrates in their Scarlet Robeta, and the Fown-Council in their formalities, attended with a guard of too of ihe principal Burghers, bearing gilded Partifans, who made a lane from thence to the Palace, where in the Guard-ftall the Eiflop znd all thid Clerey of this City, attended to pay their refpects to their Royal Highnefies; all the Ladies of Quality in Town, being likewife chese to wait upon the Duchers. There Yobn Drummend of Eumadin, Lieut. Confable of the Lafle, under the Dake of Lauderdale, prefented the Keys of the faid Cafle to the Duke : The Lord Provoft, the Mat gifrates, and Town-Council, came likewif to wait upon his Royal Hig' nefs, and the Iord Provolt; in the name of the City, in an Excellent Speech, ,expreffed theic' great joy at his Royal Highneffes arri2 wal there, and gave frefh affurances of their conflant Loyalty to His Majelty, and of their firm ad* herence and affedion to the Royar Line: as alfo of theic particular refped and affection to his Royal Highn $f$ fe, which they promifed to manifict on all occafidns, and then preiented bim the Keys of the City in silvet, which the Duke having immediare.子y delivered back, as likewite thofe of the cafte to the Lieutenarit-Conftablo, tayried them to kifs the Ducheffes hand; at night all the Conduits at the Crofs ran with wine, the Strects were filled with Bonfires '(which were fo great and numerous, that the whold Town feemed one fire) the Bells rang, end all the Prople were zealous to demonfrrate the foy they had to feoa Prince fo nearly selated to His Majelty and the Crown among them. This day the Lords of the Seffion, with the whole Body of the Colletge of Juftice in intheir formalisios, waited upon his Royal Highnefs; the Lord Prefident making ax tlaquent Spocth, to welcome his Roy-

of the Royal Bourroughs (who make the third Etate of Parliament in this Kingdom) were lik: wile to compliment bis Royal Higlonicts, and the Lord Provoft of this City (the coinfant Prctident of their Conventiond made a very hearty and loyal Speceh, in behalf of all the Royal Burroughs, particułarly expreffing their great fatisfaction in the happinefs thicy had of leeing his Royal Higinefs there; and declaring tiecir Fidelity and Affecion to His Majelty, and the Interelis of the Ciown. Then the Lieutenant*Gentrals with all the Officers of the flanding forces were in like manner to pay their refpects to bis Reyal Highn fs, who having returned their feveral Compliments, with many kind Expreflions, and exhorted them above ail things, to perfevere in their Lyty and Loyalcy to the king, prefuned them fo the Dutchefs, who reseived them very kindly, and declared hir felfex.treamly fatisfied with the re'pects that had bien fhewed to the Duke and her felf.
