Borgos. Nov. 23. The 13 inflant the Queen of Spain parted from Vittoria, and the 18 atrived at Quintana Palla, a small Village three Liagues from hence. The next morning about To a clock, she was it armed that the King, accended with many Grandees, was come thither; whereupon, her Majery being diessed after the Spanish mode, went out and met him in her Antichamber, she offered three feveral times to have kneeled, and to have kissed his Hand, but the King would not suffer it, and saluted her after the Spanish way, by pressing her Arm between his Hands, without kiffi; g her; after some Compliments had passed between them, the Kings chief Almoner performed the ceremony of giving them the scond Remediction, which was done in the Queens Antichamber; the Prince of Harcourt and the Marquis de Villars, who have the charact is of Amballadors Extraordinary, standing at the kings right hand above the Grand est During the Mass, a linnen cloth with a Silver Pilige, was put over the Qu'ens Head, and the King's Shoulle s; and a white Ribbon of two fingers broad, bount their Shoulders. The Ceremony being ended, the king and Queen Din d publickly. which they have done ever fince; the ugh if the hot the Spanish cu lour; after which they took Coach, and came and lay here. The 26 the Queen, in a Spanish Habir, made her publick Hotely Here on Horseback, followed by the Ducheis of Terranoua, and her Maids of Honor likewife on Horfeback, and the Grandees, attended with great Trains and rich Livevies, Lading the way, and conducting her to the Palace, where that right was a Comedy and Fireworks. The 21 in the morning the Prince of Harcourt made likewise his publick Entry, and that afternoon their Majesties wife rentertained with a Bull-Feast, and the next day with other Divertisements. The King has made the Prince and Princess of Hurcourt, a Present worth shence in a Coach, and have taken the nearest way to Medril, intending not to pais by Filladolid.
Copenhagen, Nev. 28. The Island of Gothand is restored to the Swedes, and the Daniel Solliers that were in Garrison there, arrived here this day.

The King of Swedens Marriage with the Princel of Denmark will be consummated in February nex at Malmore for which preparation is making here, as well as in Sweden. Several Ships have, been lold in the Baltick in the late bad weather:

Primouth! Now (23. The 26 inflant arrived here tite Monmouth; Charles Plumer Mafter from Guinea. This evening came into this flort His Majesties Ships the Dramend, Ruby, and Daramouth from the Westward, where they have been cruising.

Edenburg, Nov. 2.54 Yesterday about nine in the merning, their Royal Highrestes parted from the Duke of Lauderdales House at Lethington (where they had been most magnificently enterprint from Friday till Monday) atterded by the Lord Chincel-

lor, the Nobility and Gentry (some in their Coaches, and fom: on Horscback) whose number still inercaled us they advanced towards this place fo that the Horsemen silied all the long Sands, and from thence to the Links of Leib. (being threelong miles) at the East end of which, the standing Forces, with the Militia Regiment of this City, were drawn up in excellent order, by General Delyel, Lieurenant-General, and Commander in chief of His Majestics Forces here, as were likewise 26 Companies of the Trained Bands of this City, near the Quarrel-Holen, which latter were afterwards formed into a Lane for their Royal Hignesses to pass through, to the Water-Gate. As foon as their Royal Highnesses came to the middle of the Long Sands, the Lieutenant-General came to compliment the Duke, who lighted out of his Coach, and mounted on horseback, r ding along the front of the Borces. As he passed, the Troops and Aftillery (planted on the right wing) made feveral di'charges: Then the Ships in the Harbor of Lefth, and a battery of 16 Great Guns, upon one of the old Bastionsthere, did the like, which gave the fignal to the I aille here, where immediately the Great Royal Standard was fet up, and the Great Guas were fire, as they continued to be, till their Royal Highresses arrived at the Palace. All along the High-way from Leith to this place, were many thoulands of people, who joyned with the Forces in their acclamations of long Life and Prosperity to the King; and of Evalth and Welcome to the Duke and Duchels; at the Water-Gate their Royal Highnesses were received by the Lord Provost, and the Magistrates in their Scarlet Robes, and the Fown-Council in their formalities, attended with a guard of zoo of the principal Burghers, bearing gilded Partifans, who made a lane from thence to the Palace, where in the Guard-Hall the Eilhop and all the Clergy of this City, attended to pay their respects to their Royal Highnesses, all the Ladies of Quality in Town, being likewise there to wait upon the Duchels. There fobn Drummend of Lundin, Lieut, Confiable of the Laftle, under the Duke of Lauderdale, presented the keys of the said Cassle to the Duke: The Lord Provost, the Ma-gistrates, and Town-Council, came likewise to wait upon his Royal Highness, and the Ford Provost, in the name of the City, in an Excellent Speach, expressed their great joy at his Royal Highliesses arriflant Loyalty to His Majelly, and of their firm adherence and affection to the Royal Line: as also of their particular respect and affection to his Royal Highn is, which they promifed to manifelt on all occasions, and then presented him the Keys of the City in Silver, which the Duke having immediately delivered back, as likewise those of the Castle to the Lieutenant-Constable, carried them to kis the Duchesses band 1 at night all the Conduits at the Cross ran with Wine, the Streets were filled with Bonfires Twhich were so great and numerous, that the whole Town feemed one fire) the Bells rung, and all the People were zealous to demonstrate the joy they had to fee a Prince so nearly related to His Majelly and the Crown among them. This day the Lords of the Selfion, with the whole Body of the Colledge of Justice, in their formalities, waited upon his Royal Highness; the Lord President making an tlequent Speech, to welcome his Royal Highnest into this Kingdom. The Commissioners

of the Royal Bourroughs (who make the third Enate of Parliament in this Kingdom) were likes wife to compliment his Royal Highness, and the Lord Provost of this City (the constant President of their Convention made a very hearty and loyal Speech, in behalf of all the Royal Burroughs, particularly expressing their great satisfaction in the happiness they had of seeing his Royal Highness there; and declaring their Fidelity and Affection to His Majesty, and the Interests of the Crown. Then the Lieutenant General, with all the Officers of the flanding Forces were in like manner to pay their respects to his Royal Highn is, who having returned their several Compliments, with many kind expressions, and exhorted them above all things, to persevere in their Luty and Loyalty to the king, prefented them to the Dutchess, who re-ceived them very kindly, and declared her felfex-treamly satisfied with the respects that had been shewed to the Duke and her felf.

Dublin, Nov. 26. By Letters from Waterford of the 22 inflant we are advertised that one Mr. Brown high Constable of that City, both been kill'd upon a quarrel arrifing between him and a Soldier of the Scotch Regiment, who was flanding Sentinel.
